They Were Like Sheep Without A Shepherd

Today's Gospel shows us how important God considers those who are called to be shepherds or teachers of Catholic truth. They may be parents, teachers, politicians, judges, elected officials, religious superiors, bishops, priests and any one else who hold legitimate authority over others.

In the first reading the Prophet Jeremiah reveals God's just indignation towards those in authority who neglect God and His law, when they exercise their authority.

Saint Paul mentions the fact that all men and women are meant to experience unity and peace in the teachings and saving work of Jesus Christ. Our Lord Himself during His lifetime sent out His Apostles to the lost sheep of Israel. Yet, before His Ascension, He commanded them to go out throughout the entire world to proclaim the Gospel Message.

In today's Gospel, even though both our Lord and the Apostles are in need of rest and food, they are pressed by the crowds who hunger for the message of truth. Likewise, it can happen that those in authority such as parents, teachers, clergy, elect-ed officials can grow weary and even fail at times in their God-given responsibilities. Yet, our Lord shows us today that those who are given such responsibilities must do their best to be constantly faithful.

We might ask if such a task is beyond human capacity? The answer is yes, definitely! Than is it hopeless? No, because our Lord enter our world to impart grace and strength to a weak people wounded by sin. Didn't He say that "*apart from Me, you can do nothing*?" That is why His saving grace is absolutely necessary.

How many parents, spouses, teachers, clergy and politicians fail in their role as a shepherd, precisely because they either live apart from God's grace, or because they neglect to discern God's will or refuse to cooperate with God's grace on many occasions? Is it any wonder, that such people fail and cause problems for themselves and for those under their care? To be virtuous and faithful, one needs God's grace! This is why Jesus says to us: "*Come to Me, all who labor and are heavy lad-en, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you, and learn from Me; for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy, and My burden is light.*"

Many find it easier to just "give up" or "give in". They may find it easier to compromise with the world and with those who are either indifferent or hostile to Christ and His teachings. St. Thomas More writes: "*Attempts to be virtuous that are joined to disobedience to the will of God, no matter how good they may appear, will actually work for our damnation.*" So much for being politically correct! Remember, the obedience of St. More to God' law and truth cost him his job, his wealth, his property and eventually his head, because he would not misuse his authority!

Perhaps we ourselves, have not always exercised our authority with our mind's eye on our Lord and His Teachings? The Gospels show us that our Lord and the Apostles were "put to the test" many times when confronted with crowds, hostile enemies, demonic attacks, human misery, suffering and death itself. Our Lord experienced great torment in His Humanity, when in the Garden of Gethsemane He sweated drops of blood. Our Lord knows the strain of responsibility and also the capacity of a noble and generous heart, when it is filled with divine grace.

St. John of the Cross says: "What does it profit you to give God one thing, if He asks of you another? Consider what it is God wants, and then do it." God wants us to live in His grace and to be virtuous and holy, and for those in positions of authority, to imitate Him as a good shepherd.

The phrase "good shepherd" appears only three times in the Bible, all in Chapter 10 of the Gospel of John. Jesus explains, "*I* am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down His life for the sheep". And just a few verses later, He explains further, "*I* am the good shepherd. I know My own and My own know Me. Just as the Father knows Me and I know the Father. And I lay down My life for the sheep".

As Jesus was given the command by His Father to lay down His life, if we wish to conform to Christ, then like the Good Shepherd we must be willing to surrender our lives to God in truth, especially as we exercise authority in service of one another.

16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

With Labor Day just six weeks away we are in the middle of summer vacation time for most school systems. Some folks plan a significant trip for vacation, traveling some distance to visit relatives or see sights or take in events. Others work out a number of "staycation" activities that include day trips to places like the zoo, the museum, a local beach, or a nearby hiking trail. Statistics tell us that Americans work nearly 180 hours more a year than employees in many other countries. While the US labor force is at the top in productivity per employee, we are not substantially ahead of the workforce in some places with more liberal vacation policies.

This weekend's Gospel offers the same dilemma that most business owners face. The disciples reported back to Jesus what they had accomplished. He recognized their need for some quiet and rest. But they could not get away from the crowds who were continually after them. It's like the company that launches a new product or service that suddenly becomes a massive hit. The entrepreneur is faced with the problem of how quickly to expand while not over-extending the company in the market and at the same time providing for the legitimate needs of the partners and employees.

If you will, the Christian "franchise" faces some of the same problems in the world today. There is rapid expansion in some places (Africa, Asia, South America) while there is still a need to maintain "business" operations in the original markets (Europe, North America). At the same time we want to put out a quality product-if we can even talk about the message of Christ in that way. You see how the analogy breaks down very quickly. But Jesus knew that his followers needed some quiet each day to be able to show his love to others. Prayer and reflection are essential if we are ever going to be "productive" Christians.


