God is Alive and Well in Us

In April of 1966 Time magazine had a front cover with the phrase "God Is Dead" emblazoned in big, black letters. The social shapers of the 60's were telling the people that God did not matter anymore.

The phrase "God is dead" came from a German philosopher, Friedrich Nietzsche. In 1882, he wrote a book in which he depicted a madman who jumped into a crowd of people smashing a lit lantern on the ground shouting out: "Where has God gone?" The light symbolizing God. He continued: "I will tell you were God has gone! We have killed Him, you and I. We have vanquished Him like the light of this lantern!" The madman then asks his listeners: "How will the world be directed now without God?" His answer was that we must now become a super race, a race of supermen and superwomen. As we no longer need God because we now can shape reality and change with the world using our superpower of technology!

Adolph Hitler and Stalin both adopted Nietzsche's philosophy, as have many others, all of them intent upon snuffing out the light of God and trying to become gods themselves. In our day we find many similar social shapers busy at driving God out of our culture out of public life out of our schools, and our social institutions. Attempts are being made to force those who practice the Christian Religion to do only in the privacy of their homes.

Christians are being told to keep our opinions about God to themselves and that they are not welcome to express their Christian Faith in public. And if we try to do so, we will be accused of "imposing our values" on others. Our Christian Faith is being mocked with derisive questions such as: "Why do you Christians worship a dead man anyway?"

What is our response to all of this? What are we to do in a culture where many no longer wants to even acknowledge God or consider Christian values outdated and foolish in today's world? Well, its not the first time we Christians had to deal with hostility. And every time the powers of this world have tried buried the Church and declared It and Jesus dead, Our Lord and His Church have come back out of the grave resurrected and renewed, with a power beyond this world!

Remember those first disciples of Jesus who were walking on the road to Emmaus after our Lord's death on Calvary. They felt defeated and downcast, but it was in that moment that Jesus walked with them, and they came recognized Him in the breaking of the bread.

We too are gathered here for the breaking of the Bread. The Bread that sustain us in our spiritual life. Because we do not worship a man that is dead, quite the contrary, we worship the Living God, Who raised the dead and who comes to us to share His very life with us.

Our Lord in today's Gospel presents us with the teaching of Eucharist - the Living Bread that sustains us in our Faith. Take this Living Bread and eat it, and let your souls be nourished by His loving Presence, a loving presence far above and beyond anything this world could ever give us. Be nourished by the Bread of Life, and allow His light to shine forth through us in the darkness of this world.

20th Sunday in Ordinary Time

There was a man who lived on the edge of a small Midwestern town. He kept to himself, had his groceries delivered, and never ventured past his own front gate. No one made an effort to know him, and it stayed that way for nearly sixty years. When the man passed away, it was found that he had no family. The state-appointed lawyer for his estate ordered everything in his home sold or disposed of. Upon entering his home, the auctioneers found nearly every wall of the home covered in beautiful oil paintings, created by the man no one knew. He had a beautiful gift, yet he kept it to himself, and in doing so he deprived so many others of its beauty.

Today's Gospel reading from John continues the theme of Jesus as the bread of life. He tells those listening that whoever eats his flesh and drinks his blood will have eternal life. We hear these words at every Mass as the priest recites the similar words from the Last Supper. We hear them so often we might not even react to their true meaning. Yet imagine hearing them for the first time that day with Jesus! The people, who have already witnessed his miracles, still refer to him as "this man." They cannot believe.

We approach the altar solemnly, reverently. The host is placed in our hands; "the body of Christ." We are offered the cup; "the blood of Christ." And with each gift, we respond, "Amen." And it is in that amen that we are truly saying, "Yes, in receiving the true body and blood of Christ, I am becoming the body and blood of Christ and wish to share it with others." Our faith, our belief in God's saving grace, "is a treasure of life which is enriched by being shared" (CCC 949).
