### Pope Francis: Sundays are a gift from God – don't ruin it

In today's Gospel Jesus tells us that: The one who feeds on Him will have life because of Him. And yet upon hearing this, some of His followers turned and left Him, saying that His words were hard to accept.

Jesus turned to the Apostles and asked them, "*Do you also want to leave*?" And Simon Peter answered Him, "*Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.*" Peter and the Twelve were renewing and reaffirming their need to be fed by Jesus. How about you and I?

Pope Francis reminds us in a recent talk that he gave, of our need to be refreshed and renewed by Jesus, especially during the Sunday Mass. He also spoke of the human need for moments of rest and celebration within families, so as to live life in a more human way. *"Celebration is a precious gift from God, made for the human family. Let's not ruin it."* 

The Pope noted that a break in the routine is God's own invention, when God Himself rested from His work on the seventh day. God teaches us the importance "of dedicating time to contemplating and enjoying the fruits of our labors, not only in our employment or profession, but through every action by which we as men and women cooperate in God's creative work," he said.

Pope Francis emphasized that "to celebrate" involves returning our gaze to the fruits of our labor with both gratitude and benevolence. Celebration, he continued, "is above all a loving and grateful look at work well done, and means taking time to pause and be with friends and loved ones." He added, that celebration is a time to watch our children grow, to look at the home we have built, and think: how beautiful!" The Pope pointed out that it is also possible to celebrate even in times of difficulty.

He further explained that celebrations in life are meant to be a healthy influence in our lives, such as birthdays, marriages, a new baby, a farewell or a welcome. Such moments of familiarity put a brief stop to "*the routine of work and they do us good*!" he said. True moments of celebration make us take a break from the daily grind, and remind us, "*that we have been created in the image and likeness of God, who is not a slave to work, but the Lord of work.*"

"We too must never be slaves to work, but rather its master." This over-emphasis on gain and technical efficiency "attacks human rhythms of life and denies the human person the time for what's really important." He continued, Let us also banish this idea of a celebration as something centered on drunkenness and debauchery, and let us regain its sacred value, seeing it as a privileged time in which we can encounter God and others."

Pope Francis pointed to Sundays as a particularly important time for rest, because "*on Sundays we are called to seek out God.*" Going to Mass brings the grace of Jesus Christ to each of our celebrations, he said, since it is in the Eucharist that we encounter His presence, love and sacrifice. The Eucharistic celebration, he said, is Jesus' way of being with us and forming us into a community.

*"Everything is transfigured by His grace: work, family, the joys and trials of each day, even our sufferings and death."* Pope Francis cautioned that the ideologies of greed and consumption want to "eat up" the ability to celebrate in a wholesome way.

Pope Francis concluded by praying that the family always be recognized as a privileged place where the gifts that come from our celebrations are understood, guided and sustained, particularly by attendance at Sunday Mass. "*May the Lord allows us to experience the time of rest, family celebrations, and the Sunday Mass, with the eyes of faith.*" He continued, "*May we see it as a precious gift which illuminates family life.*"

### 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

"As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him." These departing disciples followed Jesus to a point, but when they encountered a teaching they didn't like, they decided to leave. That was their free choice. And Jesus respected their freedom by letting them go. Then, he turned to the Twelve Apostles and asked, "Do you also want to leave?" Thankfully for us and the entire history of Christianity, Peter replied, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."

We have the same choice to make. Will we follow Jesus no matter what, or will we abandon our faith in him if his ways become too uncomfortable? Our decision, too, makes an impact on history. What we choose--how we live our lives, how we witness to the world around us, how we minister to our friends and neighbors, and how we raise our children--all makes a difference. If our faith only goes as far as our comfort zone, then our witness will be a weak one. But if we stand firm, aligning ourselves with Christ even when being Christian means being unpopular or countercultural, then we will make a difference. We won't just be swept along in a stream of indifferent, lukewarm people who are more interested in maintaining the status quo than in living a life that bears witness to the truth. In today's Old Testament reading, Joshua speaks about choices to the Jewish people. He urges them, and us, "Decide today whom you will serve." And then, he courageously declares, "As for me and my household, we will serve the LORD." May we have the courage of Joshua to make the right decision and stay faithful to the Lord.


