# God's Laws are Meant to Help Us be the Best Person Possible

If we want be, a great athlete, or an accomplished musician, writer, doctor, or a successful business person or farmer, we have to live a life of discipline.

To be the best, or good at anything, in any field, or walk of life, we have to follow a set of rules, and requires that we sacrifice other things to help us obtain our goal. And those who lack the necessary discipline or the willingness to sacrifice certain things, will never achieve their goal.

When a person doesn't have a goal in life, it becomes very easy for that person to become a slave to peer pressure, to feelings, or to the latest trend or fad. And instead of being one who is in control of their life, giving it direction, they allow their life to be divided and pulled in all sorts of unhealthy directions.

This reality is also true in our spiritual life. The choice to be a good Catholic, a good Christian, is a goal we have to set for ourselves, but also we need to have the necessary discipline to achieve that goal. Otherwise, we allow our spiritual life to fall apart, and to be pulled in many unchristian directions, to the point where we can end up becoming slaves to lesser things of this world.

The Jews in today's Gospel had kept the necessary external discipline, but they had lost the goal to be holy. And that is a danger we too can slip into, whereby we keep a mere external observance of the law, rules and discipline of the Church, going through the motions, while losing the goal to become a morally better Catholic, a spiritually better disciple of Christ. Our Lord refers to such persons as whitewashed tombs, beautifully painted on the outside, but filled with death and rottenness inside.

When we lose the goal to be morally good persons, we can easily begin to view the laws of God from the wrong perspective. We begin to see them as things that restrict and limit us, instead of something gives us direction and freedom in a wholesome way. And if we no longer have the goal of becoming a morally better Christian, or a spiritually better Catholic, the teachings of Christ and the rules and laws of His Church just become empty things we give lip service to.

Good laws enshrine morally good and wholesome values to help free us from the worst in ourselves, and instead, they empower us to bring out the best in ourselves, through God's help. And so in the today's Gospel Jesus speaks to the people, and to us the words we need to hear from time to time.

Because we live in a culture that has become self-indulgent, self-gratifying, and self-justifying, a culture that often blames everyone else for what's wrong in us and in the world. There is a total unwillingness to take responsibility for what's in our own hearts, and admitting what we have done wrong.

Jesus reminds us today that: nothing that comes from outside of us can defile us, but only those sinful things that come from within us can defile us, that is, makes us unclean in His sight. He mentions evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, and arrogance.

People are fond of saying that Jesus accepted everyone and tolerated everything they did. But Jesus says that morally evil actions defile us. And His grace gives us the ability to choose for good and to do what is right, and to protect us from the bad that could corrupt us. His teachings and the laws of His Church are His gifts to us, that make us pleasing in His sight.

These gifts of His, give us the freedom and strength to be morally good, and they ought to lead us to what we hope to be; true sons and daughters of our Heavenly Father.

# 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile." In the days of Jesus, this issue was about performing empty external rituals of cleanliness instead of purifying the heart. For most of us, the issue is probably a bit different. Our fixation on externals is not so much with religious prescriptions and practices; instead, our daily obsession tends to be with appearances in general. In our media-saturated culture, we are extremely tuned in to how things look. We are trained to respond to current fashion trends in clothing, hair, makeup, and accessories. Even bodies, cars, houses, and landscaping all fall into the realm of highly marketed images. The risk for us is to be so concerned with having the right "look" on the outside that we fail to consider what's happening on the inside.

Life is about more than what we have or what we parade around for others to see. As human beings we are a unity of body and soul, and if we neglect our souls, then we are neglecting the fulfillment of our human nature. We need to make sure we are not like the Pharisees in today's reading who were too concerned with outside appearances. Jesus tells us in response to them that "from within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within and they defile." This list makes a good starting point for some personal meditation on our interior life. Let's ask ourselves, "Which of the behaviors on this list threaten to defile my soul?" Then, let's ask the Holy Spirit to help purify us of that spiritual ugliness so we can appear beautiful in the sight of God.

# Wondering What to Pray For?

In the coming months we will see the World Meeting of Families and Papal visit from September 22-27 in Philadelphia, and then the 14th Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops on the Family from October 4-25. This Synod, and the Congress that precedes it, will continue to discuss "the vocation and mission of the family in the Church and in the contemporary world."

A timely topic indeed! As prayerful preparation for these last events, Pope Francis offered the following prayer:

Jesus, Mary and Joseph, in you we contemplate the splendor of true love, to you we turn with trust.

Holy Family of Nazareth, grant that our families too may be places of communion and prayer, authentic schools of the Gospel and small domestic Churches.

Holy Family of Nazareth, may families never again experience violence, rejection and division: may all who have been hurt or scandalized find ready comfort and healing.

Holy Family of Nazareth, may the approaching Synod of Bishops make us once more mindful of the sacredness and inviolability of the family, and its beauty in God's plan.

Jesus, Mary and Joseph, graciously hear our prayer.

May your summer conclude safely and joyfully, and your fall endeavors begin with prayer and lead us all to praise God.


