The Rosary and Peace

Autumn is a special time of the year. As we see the trees in their brief but colorful displays we must give glory to God for such beauty and splendor. What an incredible God we have! Yet, Jesus reminds that not one of these is as important, splendid, and beautiful, as each and every one of you! (Matthew 6:29 "... But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the furnace, will He not much more clothe you").

I long for you to discover and savor this beauty within by taking the opportunity to pray the most holy rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary every day during the month of October.

October is the month of the Most Holy Rosary. The 7th of October is the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. It was instituted to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection that she gives the Church in answer to the praying of the Rosary by the faithful. On October 7th, 1571, an armada of Venetian and Spanish boats and sailors devastated a much larger invading force of the Ottoman empire at Lepanto. The victory was attributed to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the praying of the rosary on each vessel before the battle.

In 1917, during World War I, Mary appeared to three young children, Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco, in Fatima, Portugal. She told the children to pray the rosary for peace. She added that the current war would end soon, but that an even greater, more destructive one would occur if people did not pray and come back to the Lord Jesus. The rosary, she said, was a weapon to bring an end to war and a means of peace.

St. John Paul II, in his encyclical on the rosary (Rosarium Virginae Mariae) said: "The Rosary is by its nature a prayer for peace, since it consists in the contemplation of Christ, the Prince of Peace, the one who is 'our peace' (Eph 2:14). ... Moreover, by virtue of its meditative character, with the tranquil succession of Hail Marys, the Rosary has a peaceful effect on those who pray it, disposing them to receive and experience in their innermost depths, and to spread around them, that true peace which is the special gift of the Risen Lord (cf. Jn 14:27; 20.21).

"The Rosary is also a prayer for peace because of the fruits of charity which it produces. When prayed well in a truly meditative way, the Rosary leads to an encounter with Christ in his mysteries and so cannot fail to draw attention to the face of Christ in others, especially in the most afflicted. How could one possibly contemplate the mystery of the Child of Bethlehem, in the joyful mysteries, without experiencing the desire to welcome, defend and promote life, and to shoulder the burdens of suffering children all over the world? ... How could one contemplate Christ carrying the Cross and Christ Crucified, without feeling the need to act as a 'Simon of Cyrene' for our brothers and sisters weighed down by grief or crushed by despair? Finally, how could one possibly gaze upon the glory of the Risen Christ or of Mary Queen of Heaven, without yearning to make this world more beautiful, more just, more closely conformed to God's plan?"

"In a word, by focusing our eyes on Christ, the Rosary also makes us peacemakers in the world. ... the Rosary allows us to hope that, even today, the difficult 'battle' for peace can be won. Far from offering an escape from the problems of the world, the Rosary obliges us to see them with responsible and generous eyes, and obtains for us the strength to face them with the certainty of God's help and the firm intention of bearing witness in every situation to 'love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony' (Col 3:14)".

During the coming month of October, I am encouraging, indeed, challenging everyone to pray the rosary everyday of the month. I especially urge families to pray the rosary together every night for peace in the family, for peace in our cites, our nation, and world. Jesus said true peace is the absence of fear..

Certainly the sailors and soldiers who fought against the invading soldiers of the Ottoman empire were afraid, but the rosary brought them the interior peace they needed to be victorious. Pray to Mary and she will lead you deep into the heart of her Son where you will find and receive the interior peace you need to overcome the difficulties you, and those you pray for, face.




