

#### The 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday Collection and Our Parish Debt

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

I hope everyone had a great time at the parish picnic. From what I heard we had a wonderful turnout and the weather was super! I arrived late, because of the Spanish Mass at St. Matthew, but there were still a few people around. I enjoyed what was left of the desserts and food and even got a chance to ride around on the "throne" on the back of the lawn mower.

When Bishop Callahan appointed me as pastor of Holy Name, in addition to St. Matthew, I was a little overwhelmed at first. But, I had spent time at Holy Name before and knew some of you already. Thanks to your wonderful hospitality and encouragement, a very efficient staff and volunteers, and Fr. Dan, I am getting better organized running the two parishes. Needless to say, the current building project at St. Matthew has consumed a lot of my time, but it is almost completed.

When I came to Holy Name as your associate pastor in 2002 the parish was debt free. That is no longer the case. I have met with the Holy Name of Jesus Parish Finance Council a couple of times already. One of my (our) deepest concerns is the indebtedness of the parish. Holy Name of Jesus parish is currently over \$1,000,000 in debt --- most of that is from a failure to pay the subsidy we owe to Newman Catholic Schools (NCS) each year. The last two years we paid just over \$110,000 to NCS (about \$55,000 per year) on a subsidy of about \$180,000 per year. As a result in each of the last two years we have assumed a \$127,000 debt to the Diocese – or over \$254,000 during the past two years alone. In addition, the debt to the Diocese accumulates approximately \$11,000 in interest each year.

The failure to reach our parish goal for The Diocesan Annual Appeal (DAA) also adds to our indebtedness each year. Any amount we are short (over 10,000 last year – 2014-2015) gets added onto our debt. This year's DAA shortfall was paid for with money earned through SummerFun. That is money that could have been used for other needs of the parish if we had reached our goal.

I don't know how well this indebtedness was communicated to you in the past and I am sorry if this is a surprise to some of you. But I promise to be very open about the financial situation of the parish in the future. Obviously, this is a serious situation but not a hopeless one.

Needless to say, we cannot continue to accumulate debt. We have to find ways to cut costs, to pay our monthly subsidy to NCS and pay our parish bills, while at the same time trying to chip away at our debt. We have an obligation as a parish and as people committed to catholic education for our children to support our Catholic schools. Thankfully, we were able to lower subsidy payments for all of the parishes in Wausau for the current fiscal year (2015-2016). Holy Name of Jesus was lowered by over \$20,000 to \$159,000 per year.

In the past, the second collection on the first Sunday of each month was directed toward different ministries. From now on this collection will be used solely to pay off the parish debt. I know you all love this parish immensely and trust you will be generous in supporting the goal to eliminate our parish debt.


