### Pope Francis on God's Plan for Marriage

Pope Francis told the participants at the Synod on the Family on Sunday, October 4, 2015, that the union between a man and woman is the foundation of God's plan for the family, and a solution to the many forms of loneliness in today's world. "This is God's dream for His beloved creation: to see it fulfilled in the loving union between a man and a woman, rejoicing in their shared journey, fruitful in their mutual gift of self."

In his homily, Francis noted how the first reading from Genesis, which recounts the story of creation, speaks to us of Adam's experience of solitude before the creation of Eve. Although Adam was given dominion over the garden and the other creatures, he "felt alone, because there was not found a helper fit for him. He was lonely."

The Pope then pointed to several forms of loneliness in modern society, and said that despite living in a globalized world filled with mansions and skyscrapers, the warmth within families today is diminishing. While people have great ambitions and many different forms of entertainment, they have little time or freedom to enjoy them, he noted.

"There is a deep and growing interior emptiness," he said, adding that "the number of people who feel lonely keeps growing, as does the number of those who are caught up in selfishness, gloominess, destructive violence and slavery to pleasure and money." Like Adam, the world today experiences power but also vulnerability and loneliness, Francis observed, explaining that this fits the image of the modern family.

"People are less and less serious about building a solid and fruitful relationship of love. Love which is lasting, faithful, conscientious, stable and fruitful is increasingly looked down upon, viewed as a quaint relic of the past," he said. "It would seem that the most advanced societies are the very ones which have the lowest birth-rates and the highest percentages of abortion, divorce, suicide."

God's words, the Pope said, "show that God did not create us to live in sorrow or to be alone. He made men and women for happiness, to share their journey with someone who complements them... to love and to be loved, and to see their love bear fruit in children." Francis referred to how in the Gospel, Jesus was questioned about divorce by the crowd, who practiced and established it as an "inviolable fact," and wanted to trap him.

Jesus teaches us "that God blesses human love, that it is he who joins the hearts of two people who love one another, he who joins them in unity and indissolubility." Francis explained that for God, "marriage is not some adolescent utopia, but a dream without which his creatures will be doomed to solitude! Indeed, being afraid to accept this plan paralyzes the human heart." Paradoxically, there are many people who ridicule this plan while continuing to be attracted to true, steadfast and faithful love, he said. "We see people chase after fleeting loves while dreaming of true love; they chase after carnal pleasures but desire total self -giving."

Pope Francis then said the Church is called to carry out her mission regarding family life in fidelity, truth and love. In fidelity to Jesus, the Church is called to defend faithful love and encourage families whose married life reveals of God's own love.

### Suffering for the Ones We Love

The first followers of Jesus, including His apostles, were not immune to fears and weaknesses, they were like us in many ways, with the normal desires for success, competition and power. One of the most insightful aspects of the Gospels, is the honesty of the imperfections of those closest to our Lord.

The apostles are shown to be persons who over time grew in their faith, and through their failures and struggles became better followers of Jesus. They, like most of us, traveled a rough road to get there, and no doubt they still retained a certain amount of frailty and brokenness throughout their lives. Which, if we are honest resembles our reality as well.

The point of today's Gospel is to assure us, that if we want to be faithful in following Jesus in taking our Catholic Faith seriously, we will experience frailty, brokenness and suffering. There is no other way to follow our Lord and to be faithful to His teachings. Such faithfulness will at times, cause us inconvenience, rejection, ridicule and sacrifice. If we follow behind our Lord it always be in the shadow of His Cross.

At various points in our life we will be challenged to see our cross of suffering in a Christian light, in the light of the teachings of Jesus, and in the light of His own example.

This challenge will at times be hard for sure, but also a means to bring out in us the best version of ourselves: to be honest, to be faithful, to be trustworthy, to be helpful, to be one who can forgive, etc.

Our Lord knows how to suffer, and His life shows us how to accept suffering for love of Him and for love of others. We can be hesitant and fearful to embrace the cross of suffering. These are normal human reactions. Christians are not ask to seek out suffering and pain for its own sake or to become a stoic immune to pain and suffering.

Christians are asked to accept and even for the more heroic, to embrace suffering for the sake of the Kingdom, out of love for our Lord, and out of love for our sisters and brothers. It is a sign that we too are willing to drink of the Lord's cup, to really be His disciple. To drink of the Lord's cup, means we are willing to suffer for those whom we love.

Some choose to run away from suffering or to find ways to avoid it through alcohol, drugs, violence or living an immoral life. Yet, by doing that, those persons fail to experience the transforming power of one who freely and perhaps even willingly embraces suffering for the sake of another. The question is: are we willing at times to drink from same the cup that our Lord Himself drank from?

I'll conclude with the word of St. Teresa of Calcutta:" For Christian Love to be real, at times it must cost, at times it must hurt, at times it must empty us of self."






