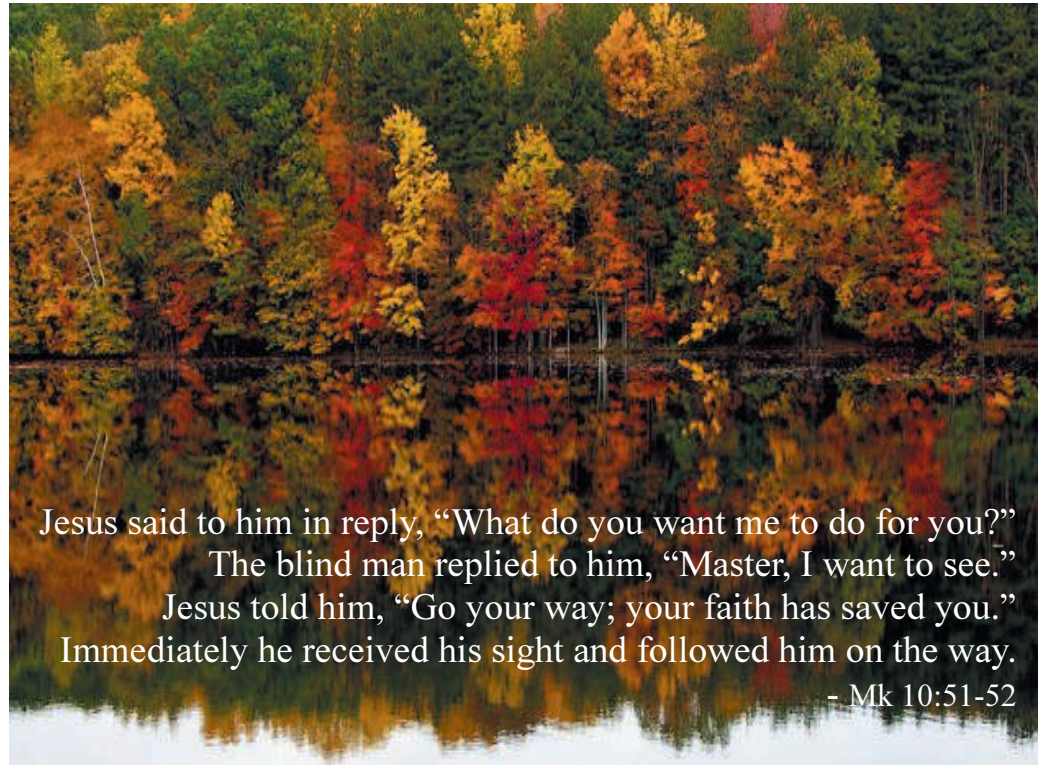

BARTIMAEUS THE BLIND MAN WHO REALLY WASN'T BLIND

Bartimaeus appeals to the mercy of Jesus. However, because Jesus was teaching, the crowd of listeners surrounding Jesus tells Bartimaeus to shut up. Nevertheless, Bartimaeus perseveres with his shouts. Because he knows what he wants and he knows that this is the time to ask for it. Jesus heard him and said, "Call him over."

So the blind man threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and was led to Jesus. Bartimaeus asked for what he wanted. And Our Lord responded with a miracle. Today's Gospel story reminds us of how important it is to know what to ask of Jesus, and to persevere in that prayer.

For a host of reasons we sometimes stop praying or we pray very poorly. Sometimes if we do pray, we neglect to look within ourselves to see what our real needs are. What stops us from praying? What stops us from looking within ourselves? Perhaps fear, anger, guilt, broken heart, temptation, apathy?

Do we feel that we don't deserve to be happy? Are we afraid of holiness? Are we angry at God for some reason? Are we tempted away from prayer by worldly activities or sinful desires? Have we marginalized our relationship with Jesus?

Today's Gospel reminds us to think what kind of prayer life we have. And hopefully it challenges us to reflect on what we might be missing in our life. Bartimaeus said that he wanted to see. What is it that we want? Do we have the faith to ask for it in our daily prayers?

What is interesting with Bartimaeus is that when our Lord said, "Go, your faith has saved you". Where did Bartimaeus go? The Gospel tells us that he followed Jesus, unlike the wealthy young man who went away from Jesus and was sad. So it would appear that Bartimaeus had been spiritually united to Jesus. He only needed his sight back so he physically follow Him.

So the question is, are we are spiritually united to Jesus? If we are not spiritually united to Jesus in grace, then that has to be our priority in prayer. Saint Augustine imperfectly prayed to Jesus: "Lord make me chaste, but not yet." He had to first be willing to control his passions by praying for that grace, before he could pray for the other graces which he would need, in order to allow him to follow after his Lord.

What about us? What imperfect prayers are we praying? What are we not yet willing to do or give up or suffer? That is the grace we first need to ask for. And only after we receive that grace, to remove whatever obstacles there may be in being united to Christ, can we ask for other graces to follow Him more perfectly.

Bartimaeus was physically blind but he was not spiritually blind. How many of us have physical sight, but unfortunately find ourselves spiritually blind? Perhaps this is a good time in our life to pray a real simple prayer every day until it is answered: "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me."

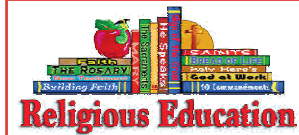

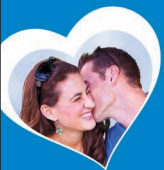

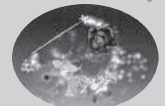
