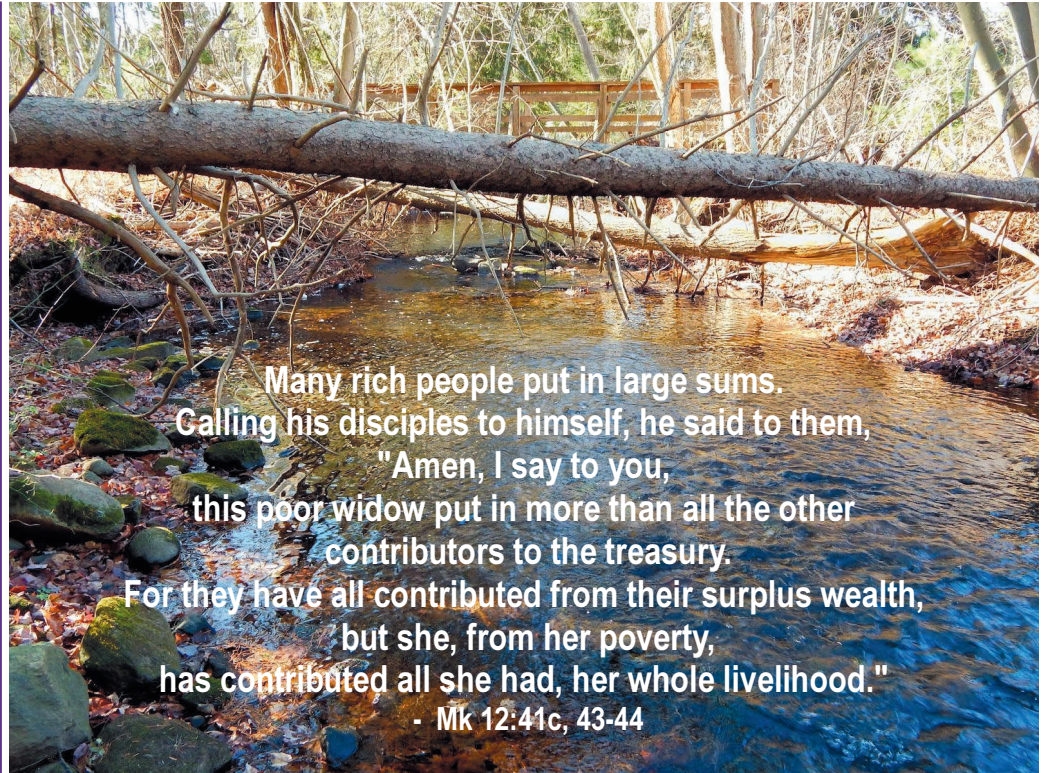

The Two Widows Who Trusted in God

In the first reading today and in the Gospel reading we meet two widows who are similar. Both are everyday, hard working women. Both are poor. Both put their trust in God. Both are rewarded for their faith.

The first widow in the First Reading, is from Zarephath. Elijah traveled to Zarephath during a famine. As in all famines, the rich complain, and the poor starve. The woman was poor. When Elijah met up with her, she was getting the last few pieces of food she had left to eat with her son. Imagine now a stranger goes up to this woman and asks for food in the name of the Lord. Elijah also must have been near starvation. Hospitality to strangers was a law of God. The widow had to make a choice to either honor God's law and feed this stranger, taking from her and her son some of the little food they had, or tell him to go elsewhere. The woman made the choice to follow God's law of hospitality, and putting her trust in God fed Elijah, and in a miraculous fashion she received enough for her, her son and Elijah to eat for a full year.

The second widow in the Gospel, put two small coins into the Temple treasury. Jesus was people watching, sitting across from the treasury. There were big shows as some of the wealthy came forward letting everyone know about their great generosity. After all, the money from the wealthy, had paid for most of the rebuilding of the Temple. What value did the widow's small coins have next to their thousands? But Jesus knew how much her giving cost her. He said that her donation of a few coins, although it seemed insignificant, was tremendous, because she made sacrifices in her life to give to God. Her donation was an act of trust and an act of love for God.

The generosity, trust and sacrifices exemplified by these two widows has been imitated by many in our parish today. Among us are those with great faith, who sacrifice and give according their ability. Yet, at times, God will call each one of us to go beyond what seems humanly possible, by an act of deep faith in Him and His promises. These moments will require a tremendous amount of trust in God.

Unfortunately, it has become normal, even for Christians, to look for solutions to problems and difficulties only through human means which appear realistic and reasonable apart from God. Perhaps as rugged individualists we think that we can solve our own problems, conquer all obstacles ourselves. Certainly, there is a huge push in society to make us believe that the choices we make in life, has nothing to do with Christian principles or a relationship with God.

In fact, the great fallacy of our age is to convince us that God doesn't exist, that Jesus was just a nice human person who said and did positive things, but that human solutions alone can solve any and all problems to get us through life. It is the job of Satan to convince us that we can find happiness apart from God's laws, and many in positions of influence are spreading that message loud and clear.

However, human solutions apart from faith in God and His laws make a mess of things, and cause great harm to the dignity of the human person and to society. It is very important to our spiritual, mental and even emotional well-being as a human person, to have faith in Jesus, as our Savior and Redeemer and in His teachings, as the way to fulfillment in this life and eternal happiness in the next.

This is the radical message of today's readings, asking us to place our confidence in God, living in a way that we know will please Him, trusting that all actions, done out of love Him, are seen by God. This is difficult to do because it demands our practicing the forgotten virtue of humility. A humble person recognizes where he or she stands before God. A humble person recognizes his or her profound need for God. A humble person is certain that the presence of God in his or her life is fundamental to happiness.

The two widows gave of what they had with trust. They put their trust in God showing by their actions that His presence in their lives was infinitely more important than anything they possessed, even more important than everything they owned. Many in the Church, like these two widows, do give of themselves by following Jesus and His teachings to help others. Many also give generously to the Church by way of being active in councils, fund-raisers, religious education, liturgies and so many volunteer activities.

There are times that we can become disappointed in our world, in our American society, and even in our fellow Catholics. Sadly, a number of them ignore the teachings of Jesus, while others no longer go to Mass, or support the Church, some others place work or sports above church responsibilities and obligations. A number of schools and colleges, indoctrinate our children into the glorification of secular values while also subtly mocking those who believe in the spiritual life and Christian principles.

When we feel discouraged we need to put our trust in God. No where in Scripture did He say that His followers would be in the majority. But He did say that He would be with us. Like the two widows, we need to live out our life knowing that the Good Lord sees and knows all, especially when we make sacrifices, large or small, in being faithful to our Catholic Faith as disciples of Jesus.

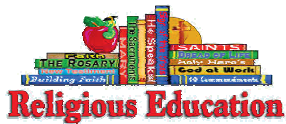

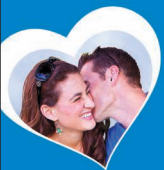

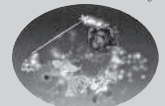
