

Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time: The Wise Shall Shine Brightly

Today's readings are scary. Daniel says that a time is coming which will be unsurpassed in distress. Jesus also talks about this time when he says that the sun will be darkened, the moon will not give off light, the stars will fall from the skies, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. These words of Daniel and our Lord certainly engage our imagination and emotions, but they are meant to go beyond this and into our thought process. Who am I? Why am I here? How am I living my life? What value does my life have? What motivates my actions? Does good and evil exist? Do I have existence beyond this world?

Today's readings are meant to remind us that our lives do not end with our deaths, but continue on into another way of life, depending on how we lived our lives in this world. Daniel reveals that the end times will be scary, but not for those who remain faithful to God, for they shall escape everlasting destruction. The wise shall shine brightly and those who lead others to justice shall be like the stars forever. While Jesus says that He will send out His Angels to gather His elect, that is, those who remain faithful to Him and His teachings throughout the earth.

So the question is, "*How scared should we be?*" The answer is really another question, "*How faithful are we to Jesus and His teachings?*" If we are faithful to the Lord, we have no reason to fear the end of time. In fact, every day we have many opportunities to show our faithfulness to the Lord and His teachings. People are longing for meaning, purpose and fulfillment in life. Sadly however, we can also chose to be unfaithful to Him and deny our purpose in life.

It is not easy to be faithful Catholics when we live in a society that promotes self indulgence and immorality. Loving God and our neighbor in a true Christian and sacrificial way as Jesus has taught us, is certainly a challenge nowadays. "*What's in it for me?*" is the normal question many ask, instead of "*what is the right thing to do?*" The unbelievers of our society, who do not believe in Jesus or His teachings, cannot see the value of another person, except as a means for their own advancement. They use other people for their own personal gain. The concept of helping others because they bear the image of God carries with it no personal gain, at least not here on earth. It takes courage to withstand the temptation to care only for oneself.

The work place, school, home, sports, are places where unbelievers encourage people to use others. Be it for career advancement or for better grades, they misuse others for their own gain. People cheat and steal what others have done, or they lie about others or reveal ugly things about them to others so as to ruin their lives. It is from this sort of mentality which Christians pray to be delivered from. Perhaps unbelievers will become rich or famous through lying, cheating and other sinful ways, but the Christian is concerned with remaining faithful to Jesus and His teachings, knowing that a final judgment awaits all men and women.

The Lord knows that we can reject evil with His grace. Yet, we have free will and can choose not to be faithful. We should not allow the unbelievers of our society to convince us that we have no choice but to join in with the evil. All people are created to be good. Jesus is calling us to be true to that goodness by being faithful to Him and His teachings. We should not fear the end of time. Nor should we fear the end of our own time, our death. What we should fear is going along with unbelievers, and in doing so, choosing to reject Jesus and His teachings.




