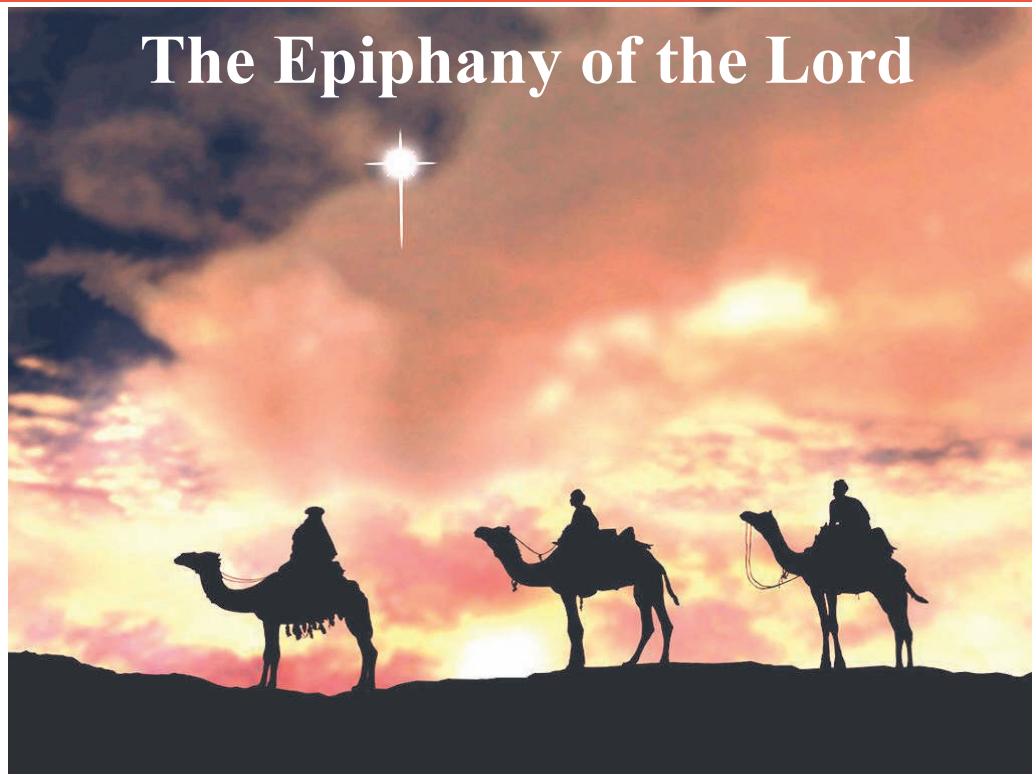

## EPIPHANY

When I visit homes this time of the year I look for the manger scene and try to find the three kings. People find unique places for them to begin their journey to the Christ child. Sometimes they begin in another room in the house and slowly move (travel) to the manger scene for the feast of the Epiphany.

Last weekend after Mass someone told me about the manger scene in her home. It's up on a table and the three kings are below the table on a stand from where, step by step, they move to the manger.

When I was a growing up our manger scene was in the dining room on the buffet. The three kings (and their camels and attendants) started their journey on the opposite side of the room on the fireplace mantel. Day by day they would process across the top of the fireplace mantel to the top of the piano, then to the top of the radiator and finally to the manger scene in time for the feast of the Epiphany.

The journey for the Magi was the longest part of their experience. They traveled for months to catch a momentary glimpse of the baby Jesus, and present their gifts. I wonder if it was a boring journey? Did they run into a sand storm? Were they worried about bandits? I imagine they were tired and cold when they finally arrived in Bethlehem?

No matter what they experienced on the journey it all melted away — was a distant memory — as they experienced that singular moment of adoration and worship before the baby king. This was the fulfillment of their journey, the pinnacle. That brief moment face to face with the Redeemer filled them with hope. They left assured, reassured and filled with peace and a sense of fullness — God is with us. God has not abandoned us. God is one of us.

We come here on a journey to an encounter with Jesus. It is a journey which is unique and unrepeatable. No one experiences or ever will experience what you individually undergo on this journey. There is no turning back. Every hour of every day we go on this journey YES, it's rough. The way to Jesus is not always easy. Fatigue, busyness, doubts, misplaced priorities, fear and mistrust are stumbling blocks along the way. Sometimes we can feel like we've really lost the way. "Where are you Jesus? I feel so confused and uncertain you are there for me. Please give me a sign of your love and presence in my life" ... an epiphany.

So, it is important to have a guide and a map. Someone to help you see where you have gone astray and redirect you to Him. The Magi were wise men and they have taught us a good lesson about keeping focused on the star ... Jesus Christ.

We journey from our homes to this church to gather in the presence of God. We come to worship and we give Him the gift of our very lives. Like the Magi we prostrate ourselves and pay homage to Jesus, our Redeemer and King. Jesus answers our prayer with a beautiful epiphany ... the revelation of his hidden presence among us made visible in His sacred Body and Blood. As we take part in that gift we are given strength for the journey and invited to become like Christ ... visible manifestations of God's loving presence in the lives of everyone we meet. Like the magi we leave reassured, filled with peace and a sense of fullness God is with us, and will never abandon us. Never give up hope!

## Our Catholic Faith Through the Ages

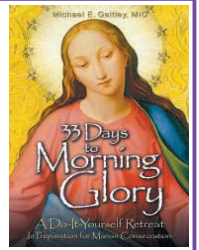
**Fr Dan's lecture series on the history of the Catholic Faith this Advent.**

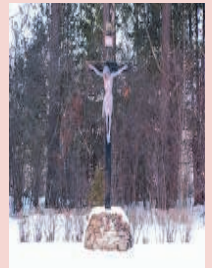
#### Beloved, Forgiven & Merciful Silent Retreat

## Blessing of Homes and Chalk on Epiphany

A common tradition on Epiphany is the blessing of homes. Why on Epiphany? This is the traditional date when the Three Wise Men arrived in Bethlehem to see the Christ Child. Guided by the star these three foreigners presented their gifts to Our Lord. Though their names are not found in Scripture, tradition has identified them as Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. Thus when a home is blessed on Epiphany some blessed chalk is used to mark the trim above the entrance door with the initials of these Three Kings. For instance the current year would read 20 + C + M + B + 16. The three letters may also stand for Christus Mansionem Benedicat which in Latin means - May Christ Bless this House.
