

"Separation of Church and State" has become "Separation of religion from society"

We heard in today's Gospel: "The Holy Spirit is upon Jesus, because Holy Spirit has anointed Him to bring glad tidings to the poor. The Holy Spirit has sent Him to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free."

Can this work of our Lord be realized in our times? well the answer depends largely upon us. A huge part of human misery is either due to the unwillingness of Christians to live out their Christian faith in words and deeds, or because of the rejection of the Christian message by others. The phrase "separation of Church and State" which was suppose to protect religious freedom and it has been twisted by many in our society to mean total separation of anything religious, anything Christian, from society.

Every year the Christian aspects of Christmas Easter and Thanksgiving celebrations are being removed from society. The value of Human life is being undermined by the promotion of abortion and euthanasia as something beneficial and good. The definition of marriage and family are being totally reshaped to the point where many no longer believe that they are in nature as designed by a loving Creator. Many children no longer have the security of growing up in an intact traditional family.

Christian moral values and truths, which have been the bedrock of our American society, are being replaced with false "rights and demands", including various type of depravity, which is tearing apart the fabric of our society. Freedom of choice, has come to mean you have the right to do anything you feel like doing, unless it is based in Christian moral values.

Christian moral norms are being pushed into the home of the believer as something private and personal and we are told that our faith should have no bearing in our public activities or public policies and Christian Moral Values are not to be taught in our public schools. One would have to be blind, not to see that the separation of Christian moral values from public life, has brought moral sickness into our American society.

True liberty and true freedom of choice in our American society, has only been experienced by acting morally with each other, based upon Christian principles. President Thomas Jefferson wrote, "No nation has yet existed or been governed without religion. Nor can it be. The Christian religion is the best religion that has been given to man, and I as chief magistrate of this nation am bound to give it the sanction of my example."

Compare those words with our present president who stated a few years ago: "This nation is no longer a Christian nation." How sad that some consider it their goal, to make this statement a reality. The more we fall away from Christian morality, the more we experience: disunity, sexual exploitation, the rejection of the important of both fatherhood and motherhood, the neglect and abuse of children, family disintegration, violence, the denial of inherent rights, abuse of power, corruption and deceit by those in authority.

The answer to these problems is always more regulations, more laws, and less freedom for all, and they totally ignore personal responsibility and the need for Christian morality. On the walls of the Jefferson Memorial in Washington, D.C. you will find this quote: "Can the liberties of a nation be secure when we have removed a conviction that these liberties are the gift of God?

Our Lord lived and died to bring freedom, light and truth to all throughout the ages, who may be held captive in webs of sin, lies and deceit. Christian values are life-giving and liberating: Honoring our Heavenly Father, respecting life, living honestly and truthfully, establishing justice, working for peace, and building up wholesome families, are all things that we Americans should be proud of. We are called to live out our Catholic/Christian Faith giving witness at times boldly and courageously.

Let us proclaim the values and the freedom that Jesus Christ suffered, died and rose from the dead to give us. Because of Christ, St. Paul wrote in his Letter to the Romans, and to us, that we are called to walk in the glorious freedom of the children of God.


