

Mountain Climbing During Lent

The Gospels mention the four mountains in connection with our Lord: 1.) The Mount of Temptation; 2.) The Mount of the Beatitudes; 3.) Mount Tabor; 4.) and Mount Golgotha. And how all four mountains are ultimately linked to our Salvation.

Several years ago I was visiting an elderly man in a nursing home, (the only time I ever saw someone in a nursing home with his prized mounted deer head above his bed) and he told me a story, that may seem familiar to some of you, who may have had a similar experience. He was out hunting out west in the mountains. It was a real cloudy day and the clouds were dense and hanging low right down to the camp itself. And so he headed up to the top of the nearest mountain. It took him about five hours to reach the top of the mountain. And once there he found himself above the clouds, the sun was shinning brilliantly with a beautiful blue sky.

And with this story in my mind, we ought to realize that during Lent, every year the Church goes mountain climbing. We go, like Peter and James and John did, following our Lord. But why? Why does Jesus take this time away from His mission? Why do we take valuable time away from our busy lives and devote ourselves to climbing the same mountain? Aren't there jobs to be done? Bills to be paid? Children to be fed and clothed? Sick to be tended to? Persons to be visited? Mark Twain once said: "You can't depend on your eyes when your imagination is out of focus."

We climb Mount Tabor every year during Lent, to refocus our minds for the same reason Moses climbed Mount Pisgah: to get a glimpse of the Promised Land, and to see clearly where we ourselves are headed. Much like that elderly man, who wanted to get above the clouds and fog of this world, to behold the beauty of a view that was just a short distance up – well five hours! Wouldn't it be nice if Heaven was only a five hour walk up a mountain trail?!

On Mount Tabor, the Apostles who were with Jesus, were able to see Him transfigured in glory. And it is: "*By Him, and with Him, and in Him, the glory of God shines upon us*". Jesus knew on Mount Tabor that would face a much more difficult journey up another mountain. Namely, Mount Calvary. And on that mountaintop, He would be lifted high upon a cross, above the fog and clouds of this world, to behold a different view and a different vision: the salvation of all humanity. It is God's intention that we too should be destined for glory, a glory that will make us shine, like Jesus shone. But before that, we will share in carrying some part of His cross, as we climb another not-so-pleasant mountain.

And so every Lent offers us the opportunity to spiritually climb Mount Tabor with our Lord, because life, with its ups and downs is not easy, and it helps when we get a glimpse of God's glory, a glory we too hope to share one day! Such a glimpse helps to strengthen us, when we return back down the mountain to our ordinary life. My friends said, that it was so beautiful on that mountaintop that he wanted to stay there forever. But, he had another five hour journey to make, back down to the camp before nightfall.

In Lent, we remember that while we all share some suffering in life, that our destiny is one of eternal glory. So this Lent, let each one of us do a little mountain climbing, to lead us to a vision above the clouds of ordinary life, to see a glimpse of God's glory. A glimpse, which will strengthen us to continue our pilgrimage on earth as true Christians, so that we too may share in our Lord's glory forever!




