The Prodigal Son, A Story For Lent

This Sunday we have a Gospel, which has three homilies built into one: 1.) the parable of the Prodigal Son; 2.) the Parable of the Forgiving Father; 3.) the Parable of the Older Brother.

First we look at the younger brother: Perhaps we too have experienced the sadness of living the wrong way in life, living in sin. Perhaps we too, came to recognize the harm our sinful ways have caused ourselves, others, and how they offend our Creator. And then in a moment of grace, we finally decided to change for the better. And through humility, repentance and conversion, we experience God's forgiveness, and hopefully the forgiveness of others. *Amazing Grace* song was composed by such a person.

When we look at the Forgiving Father: we recognize that the father was not so much concerned with his own hurt and suffering, but instead we see in him, one who was concerned about his wayward child who was lost.

And we notice the father's joy at seeing His child return and changed for the better, a child now humbled and seeking forgiveness, for the hurt that he had caused the father. This image of a loving parent, ought to be our image of God after we have sinned, especially after we acknowledge in humility, the wrong and hurt that we have caused Him, ourselves and perhaps others. And we should be ecstatic that our heavenly Father wants to restore us to His Love once again, and indeed extends His forgiveness to us, even as we begin our journey back to Him.

And then we look at the Older Brother: a difficult lesson of forgiving another, especially one who has hurt us, or someone we love. When we see someone like that, now humbled, repentant and changed, and we decide that they should not be restored to the Father's love, we are in fact excluding ourselves from God's love, and from God's forgiveness for our own faults. The *Our Father Prayer* points this out.

Yet this parable sounds almost too easy. There is something within us, call it the "dark side", that wants to champion the other side of the situation. After all, the younger son had a right to his inheritance. What he did with it, was his own business, who are we to judge! Or we might think that the older brother had a point. He's been the good one, faithfully staying by his father side. Why shouldn't he be upset that his no-good-for-nothing brother of his, who caused him and his father so much pain. Why should he be welcomed back again? Our "dark side" says: "Good riddance to that rotten brother of mine". We might even question the actions of the Father, thinking that this guy is crazy in welcoming such a bratty child back into his life. The "dark side of us" wants to hold on to a grudge, and give back pain to those who have cause us pain, or pain to those we love.

When a selfish, sinful person like the prodigal son cares only about achieving their own "happiness" regardless of the sinfulness or immorality, or the pain its causes others, they fail to consider the responsibility they have for using their life, gifts and talents in a morally good way. And like the prodigal son, they fail to see any obligations towards others, either out of a sense love, or even out of sense of justice. And so they choose to ignore the pain and suffering their actions will bring upon their family and friends. But if we try to live a morally good life, grounded in the teachings of Christ, we are choosing to do good, not only for ourselves, but for others who love us, and we are showing our gratitude to God.

Was it easy for the Prodigal Son to admit his foolishness and sinfulness before he was brought low in the gutter? Perhaps it would have been impossible. Many a person, brought low in their life, have found a new lease in life in the "gutter." It became a turning point in their life, a new beginning. It was only in the "gutter" that the prodigal son began to reflect upon his life in the larger context of family, friends, and values, beyond the immediate gratification of his senses. This led him in turn to reflect on the wrongfulness of his life, and the misuse of his money and his life, and the pain and hurt that he had caused to those who loved him. And while he knew that his older brother would still be quite ticked off at him, he never doubted the love his father had for him. The Father's love was like the last strand of hope that gave his miserable life some light. And so he took hold of that strand and returned home, a much changed person for the better.

And the prodigal son's conversion and change, would open up a new and challenging opportunity for the older son. Only someone strongly rooted in their Christian faith, will be able to forgive those who have caused them pain, or pain to those they love, even when such persons show humility, repentance and conversion.

And we need to be reminded, that our inheritance as a Christian, is something far greater than earthly goods. Our treasures in the world, is revealed in this parable, the coming home of a lost soul, the salvation of a sinner. It takes courage and a commitment to the teachings of Christ, to say that my pain and suffering is worth someone's conversion. That is what our Lord did on the Cross. And from that Cross, He calls us to do the same, when He says to each one of us, "follow Me," - follow My example".

The Season of Lent is a time for us to be in the "gutter," so to speak, to reflect upon our life in the larger context of family, friends, and values, beyond the immediate gratification of our senses. For some, to seek out a new lease in life, a turning point, a new beginning. For others, perhaps to forgive someone for the harm they have caused them. For others, perhaps welcoming back into their love and family, someone who has shown repentance and conversion.

Our Heavenly Father loves us, and the entire life and mission of Jesus, was a statement of Love, a love for His Father, and a love for each one of us. Jesus is our "older brother", Whose death on the Cross, is the greatest means of uniting each one of us to our Heavenly Father. We live under the mercy and compassion of God our Father, which we should never doubt. May we have the humility of the Prodigal Son this Lenten Season, to reflect on our own life in the light of the teachings of Jesus.
