#### Adulterous Woman

As the woman caught in adultery was being dragged to our Lord, what was going through her mind? No doubt she was terrified. Certainly these men intended to kill her. Sadly, this same thing happens to women in Muslim countries even today.

She must have been ashamed, people were laughing at her. They treated her like dirt, perhaps she thought the same of herself. Even if by some miracle they didn't kill her, what type of life would she have? Her own family had probably disowned her by now. Who would marry her? Who would give her a place to stay? Who would have mercy on her? Perhaps she thought it might even be better if she were to die, ending her sad life.

The corrupt and proud Jewish leaders, were always looking for an occasion to trap Jesus into doing or saying something, either against the Law of Moses, or against the Law of Caesar, so they could bring charges against Him. The Law of Moses demanded her death. They knew that while Jesus demanded moral change, He was also known to be compassionate towards sinners. They were certain that they had Him, that His hands were tied. Jesus would either have to oppose the Law of Moses, or join in agreement with them to put her to death.

The woman surely thought that she was doomed and that nobody cared about her. But Our Lord cared about her, just as He cares about each one of us. Then there was silence in the crowd as they picked up the stones. Oddly, Jesus just knelt down and began writing on the ground. After more silence our Lord spoke to the crowd saying, "Let the one without sin, cast the first stone."

Now they were the one's trapped! Our Lord had turned the tables on them. To throw a stone now would have amounted to denying the Law of Moses, which acknowledged all men as sinners, and in need of the yearly sacrifice of atonement. One by one they left. When alone our Lord tells the woman: "Since there is no one to accuse you, then, neither shall I. But go and sin no more." The woman left not just with her physical life, but with a new dignity. She had been forgiven. She could now embrace a new life, a new beginning.

Tradition tells us that the woman was Mary Magdalene, who became a follower of the Lord, and who stood with Mary, the Mother of Jesus, at the foot of the Cross. She witnessed first hand the price of her forgiveness. And she was blest to see the Risen Savior on Easter morning, receiving a glimpse of her own resurrection, she would one day experience. She was also the first, in a long line of sinners, to come before the Lord in guilt and shame, feeling the weight of sin, knowing that punishment was deserved, yet hoping to receive forgiveness and desiring to begin a new life. And our gracious Lord always extends His healing hand to all those who are sincere.

There are many who will approach the Sacrament of Penance during these remaining days of Lent. Some come to Church regularly and lead good Christian lives, but recognize that they need to work on the smaller sins, that still hold them back from greater holiness. Others have been away from the Lord for a long time and may have a number of serious sins on their soul. They may be full of guilt and shame. They seek forgiveness. They seek redemption. All are welcomed by the Lord in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and all are told, "Neither do I condemn you. Go now, and sin no more."




