DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

The Image of the Good Shepherd is very biblical. In the Old Testament there are many allusions to God as a shepherd. The twenty-third psalm in a Bible classic: "*The Lord is my Shepherd there is nothing I shall want*." The early Christians saw in Christ the "Good Shepherd" full of mercy and protection, a Redeemer Who reached out to save and guide His flock. In the catacombs (underground Christian cemeteries) around Rome, which date back to the 1st and 2nd century, no other etching or carving is so common as that of the Good Shepherd.

The Church has always had to deal with not only Lax Catholics, but also super-strict Catholics who make penance and austerity an end in themselves. In the second century, the Montanists were such Catholics. They taught that certain sins like idolatry, murder, adultery, and apostasy could never be forgiven. However, the Popes through the ages have held firm that Jesus, the Good Shepherd, through the ministry of the Church can forgive any sin, if the sinner is truly repentant and intends to amend their life.

Later on in the 17th century, another group of Catholics in France called Jansenists, insisted that Catholics had to maintain a high degree of perfection, including freedom even from venial sins. And that such a high level of perfection was necessary in order to receive Holy Communion. This unfortunately, led many Catholics to refrain from receiving Holy Communion and missing out on the wonderful graces they could have been receiving. While the Church has always taught that one must be free of mortal sin in order to receive Holy Communion worthily, the Church has never discouraged one from receiving Holy Communion who is still attached to venial sins.

Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, who lived in France at that time, received visions from our Lord to promote devotion to His Sacred Heart and His mercy, precisely to undo the harm and confusion that the Jansenist movement was causing. Our Lord told St. Margaret: "I desire to reveal My Heart, with all the treasures of love, mercy, grace, sanctification and salvation, so that men and women may be enriched with these divine treasures."

Even in our own times the message of the Good Shepherd, which reveals the depths of God's mercy, is very much needed. Our generation is so marked by the culture of death: abortion, drugs, sexual immorality, a crisis of faith, hope and charity; a time threatened by terrorism and war, rebellion against God in an attempt to redefine sexuality, marriage, feminism, human life and family life!

Today's feast of Divine Mercy, reinforces the image of Christ as the loving Good Shepherd and reminds us of His most merciful Sacred Heart. Our Lord's revelation given to Saint Faustina, a simple, humble, Polish nun, was given to her shortly before the outbreak of the horrors of World War II. Her vision revealed two rays of light flowing from the Heart of Jesus. These two rays, our Lord told her represented the Blood and Water that flowed from His pierced side while He hung upon the Cross.

In the *Ben Hur* Movie, if you watch crucifixion scene, you will notice that the camera slowly focuses in on the blood of Christ flowing down from the Cross, which then mingles with the rain, and then flows out through the land. The director William Wyler wanted to show how the graces of Jesus, which He obtained on Mount Calvary, flows out throughout the whole world into each and every person. Jesus continues throughout the ages to remind the world, often grown cold and indifferent to mercy and forgiveness, that His Divine Mercy reaches out to all persons through His compassionate Heart. He continues to remind the lost that He never gives up on them, and like the Good Shepherd, He wishes to bring them to the safety of good pastures.

Who in this world does not need to ask for, and receive at times, the comfort, the forgiveness, and the mercy of God? Saint Faustina quotes our Lord saying: "Let the sinner not be afraid to approach Me, for the flames of mercy are burning Me, desiring to be spent."




