#### **CELEBRATING FIRST COMMUNION**

One of the time honored traditions of growing up Catholic is the celebration of one's first communion. I remember when I was a second grader at St. Mary's Church in Janesville, Wisconsin. All of the boys wore dark blue slacks, black shoes, and white shirts with dark blue bow-ties. The girls wore white dresses with veils, white shoes, and white gloves (we received on the tongue in those days), and we all marched in with a prayer book we had received – black for the boys and white for the girls. It was a big event in which all of the family participated in some way.

Communion is one of the sacraments of initiation into the Catholic faith, the other two are baptism and confirmation --- communion can be received many times, whereas the sacraments of baptism and confirmation can only be celebrated once.

Today several of our children will receive communion for the first time. It is the start of a new era in the faith journey of these children. Where it takes them is totally up to you parents, godparents, siblings, relatives and friends. Fr Dan and I, our catechists and teachers play a role, but really, a less important role in their faith formation than you do. It is your example and your love for Jesus that will lead them to a deeper relationship with Jesus. This is a great responsibility entrusted to you by God when he gave you this child who celebrates first communion today. Do not take this responsibility lightly.

What a wonderful gift God has bestowed on us in the Body and Blood of His Son Jesus. We are so fortunate to be a part of this Catholic faith tradition which extends all the way back to the Last Supper on the night before Jesus suffered and died on the cross. Jesus knew His disciples needed this food for their hungry souls. He knew they would miss him and feel like he left them. But this gift is an intimate reminder he is right here with us ALWAYS — and, even more beautifully, through the sacrament of Holy Communion he becomes more intimate with us than any human being ever could be ... he becomes one with us — and, because he becomes one with us, we become one with the Father, God.

First Communion opens the door of our understanding of the mystery of Jesus in our lives. We received First Communion at a time in our lives when we really started to know the difference between right and wrong. We received First Communion at a time in our lives when we were ready to approach the adults' table at the party, the Eucharistic Banquet. We received First Communion because we came to learn that the Bread and the Wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus. As we are united with Him in this Holy Communion, we become, in turn, one with our brothers and sisters in faith.

"I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you will not have life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him" (John 6:48-52).




