

The Peace of the Lord

A priest friend, Father Joe, took a university course called: Inter-professional Dynamics in Crisis Management in Health Care. This course focused on persons with a life threatening illness. In it were: seven persons preparing to be nurses, seven medical students, seven law students, seven persons preparing to be hospital administrators, seven persons preparing to be social workers, seven psychology students, seven persons preparing for Church ministry. Various cases were given to the group. Each group was to offer how they would best handle a person with a life threatening illness in the various situations presented to them.

Father Joe mentioned he was wearing his clergy outfit at class. And he said in the very first meeting, one of the social worker students looked at him and said, "Why is the witch doctor here? He has nothing to offer us." There was dead silence.

Father Joe, as a seminarian, had spent two years working with children dying from cancer. But more importantly than his work with the cancer children, Father Joe told the young social worker to be, that: "When the doctor and nurses have done their best and can only keep the patient comfortable, and when the administrator is making sure that the hospital procedures are properly followed, and the lawyer is concerned with what will happen after the death, and the social worker and psychologist have no more programs to assist a person about to leave this world, they all turn to the priest or minister and ask us to do what we can for the patient."

Even in our increasingly secular world, there is still recognition of the spiritual dimension of a person. A realization that the human person is not just an animal, but an unique animal with a rational soul, made in the image and likeness of God our Creator.

Father Joe says he should have added: "We can give something that you in your fields of expertise cannot provide. We can impart "the peace of the Lord." A dying person understands very well the need for inner peace. They understand those words of our Lord in the Gospel today: "Peace I leave with you. My peace I give to you. Not as the world gives peace, do I give peace." For a dying person, this world is coming to an end, and life in this world is slipping though their fingers. A new world is about to open before them.

But as Christians, we are not suppose to wait until we are dying to experience "the peace of the Lord." We are meant to experience the joy of God's peace every day that we are united to Him by grace. This peace we can experience when we take our Catholic faith seriously. It in turn strengthens us to do what is morally right and helps us to avoid doing wrong.

It is this "peace of the Lord" that allows spouses to support each other, and to help one another face the stress of work and home, together as a couple in a Christian way. This "peace of the Lord" allows mothers and fathers to teach and guide their children in the Christian way. It is this "peace of the Lord" that allows our young people to do their school work, their sports, their various activities, in a way that allows them to grow and mature as a Christian.

Our young people nowadays, have a great need for "the peace of the Lord" to be in their hearts, with the many pressures that they face in growing up. The pressure of having friends without getting involved with drugs or alcohol. The pressure of having a girlfriend or boyfriend without crossing the line of sexual activity, which is something sacred and is to be kept for marriage. The pressure to go along with lying or stealing or destroying someone's property, just because "we can get away with doing it".

Saying "yes" to Christ and "no" to sin, should fill us with joy, because it challenges us to be the best possible person we can be, precisely because we have the peace of Christ within our hearts. Each one of us, and people we love, will at times face difficulties and problems that would be nice to simply wish away. But most problems do not go away in such a manner.

And this why Christ came two thousands years ago and continues to come to us today, especially through the Sacraments, to replace: chaos with calm; hatred with charity; confusion with knowledge; turmoil with peace.

A parishioner of Father Joe, Jamie Kelleher, who was fifteen and in the last stages of leukemia, told him: "I have lost everything. My friends are far away. I have lost my privacy. I can't do school work. I am too weak to move much. I have lost everything. But, no one can take Jesus from me." Jamie knew the peace of Christ. How about us?
