Pentecost Joy and The Living Water of the Holy Spirit

Pentecost is the birthday of the Church, the day our Lord fulfills His promise to send us His gift of the Holy Spirit. One of the word changes that took place in the Mass in 2012 that I like, were the words that the priest says in the Second Eucharistic Prayer, when he calls down the Holy Spirit upon the bread and wine: "Make holy therefore, these gifts, we pray, by sending down your Spirit upon them like the dewfall, so that they may become for us the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ."

This comparison of the Holy Spirit to water make sense. When a child is about to be born the amniotic sac breaks and releases the water -like fluid. And so the Holy Spirit like water, is unleashed, announcing the birth of the Church.

This water comparison is also made by St. Cyril of Jerusalem when he writes: All things are dependent upon water. Water comes down from heaven as rain, and although it is always the same in itself, it produces many different effects and it adapts itself to the needs of every creature that receives it. In the same way the Holy Spirit, whose nature is always the same, gives grace, strength and help to each person according to their needs and receptivity.

And so these words of St. Cyril helps us to understand why our Lord was so insistent on sending forth this Living Water, this Life Giving Spirit, as a necessary grace-filled source for all the members of His Church.

The Holy Spirit helps all of us in a general way by: discerning truth; casting out evil from our lives; resisting temptations; having self-control; doing penance when needed; maintaining a life of prayer; being a faithful husband, wife, priest, or religious; being good parents; having greater generosity; recognizing sin; being repentant of wrongdoings; having the courage to do the right thing; preparing ourselves for a holy death.

However, the Holy Spirit's also acts differently in people because each one of us has our own unique temperament, back ground, life experiences and personal vocation with various weaknesses and challenges. Sometimes unexpected or major changes or events in our life elicit a need for a greater outpouring of grace by the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit always comes gently and is made known by the inner peace which He brings to the human heart. The Holy Spirit comes to those who are open to truth and goodness with the kindness of a true Friend. He grants the seven gifts of wisdom, understanding, knowledge, counsel, fortitude, piety and fear of the Lord. In doing so the Holy Spirit reaches out to save, heal, teach, counsel, strengthen, and console those who are striving to be faithful disciples of Jesus, and active members of His Church.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful, and like the dewfall, water our lives, that we may share in Your Life and in Your Love. Amen.


