The Solemnity of Corpus Christi

Let our imaginations go back to the upper room in Jerusalem. It's nighttime, and there is a tense silence in the dark streets, as the soldiers of the Roman Emperor enforces a brutal peace throughout the city. Those living in Jerusalem experienced the violence, cruelty, frustration and bitterness of a conquered people. It was in this context that our Lord celebrated the first Mass in the Upper Room.

How many people in Jerusalem that night would think that what Jesus was doing would have any importance at all, or any lasting value in the political unrest and social confusion of the world? For that matter, how many people today in 2016 would say that what we are doing right here in our parish church has any importance or any lasting value in our world? The questions are connected, for we too see a world of terrorism, social unrest, corruption, cruelty, frustration, bitterness, and even despair.

The people living in our Lord's day, and we who live today, both need very much the Gift that was being given at the Last Supper in the Upper Room. The Gift of Jesus Himself in the Holy Eucharist.

A Gift, that when received with the proper dispositions, strengthens us in our daily lives, so we can live out the teachings of Christ, and transform the world around us in a good and positive way. A transforming power exists within a person when God's Gift dwells within them, because it gives them the strength to live in a Christian way. That is the importance of coming to Mass every Sunday! We, like the disciples in the Upper Room, are able to receive that Gift which unites us to God, and allows us to be a healthy influence in our society and in our world.

On many of the pagan gravestones in ancient Rome is the inscription: *NON FUI, FUI, NON SUM, NON CURO*. Translated it means, *I was not, I was, I am not, I do not care.* Such words reveal hearts filled with hopelessly and despair. Souls that has been seduced and beaten down by a culture that was not yet touched by our Lord's sacrifice on Calvary. Saint Paul witnessed this same emptiness in the hearts of the pagans of Athens, and summarized their way of thinking and living: *"Eat, drink, and be merry for tomorrow we die."*

Perhaps we too sense this same type of cynicism, frustration and pessimism in some around us? People who are only seeking what is passing, the material things and pleasures of this world, leading them to a dark place of emptiness. Maybe that is why our society is witnessing an increase in various addictions and self-destructive behavior? The Roman culture that surrounded Christ, with its crushing power, corrupt values, and its hunger for what is merely temporal produced a society filled with apathy.

Every Mass allows us to touch the eternal, and to receive into our souls and into our lives, a Gift of strength and power to live for something beyond this world, to live for Christ and for others. Like the Upper Room, the Mass is a place where we touch the reality of our human dignity, our personal worth and freedom in the light of the sacrifice made by Jesus on Mount Calvary.

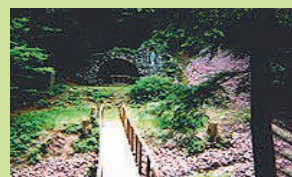
Thomas Merton Retreat

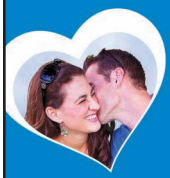
