The Compassionate Side of Jesus

All of the Gospels emphasize various aspects of our Lord's moral goodness. The Gospel of Mark emphasizes our Lord's humanity and His intense suffering. The Gospel of John presents Jesus as the Eternal Word existing for all time, who took on our flesh in our world to redeem us. The Gospel of Matthew portrays our Lord as the New Moses and Lawgiver.

The Gospel of Luke highlights the compassionate side of our Lord. And we have an example of this in today's Gospel reading. Our Lord comes upon a widow whose following her son's body being carried out by relatives and friends to be buried. He shows a deep concern for her. Her sorrow becomes His sorrow. And our Lord then works a miracle of compassion. And gives a living son back to his astonished mother, amazing all those around Him.

Elijah in the first reading calls upon God to restore life to a dead person. Jesus exercises His own divine power to restore the life to the young boy. Elijah begs God to reveal His mercy and His compassion. Jesus Himself reveals Himself to be the source of all Compassion. And He calls us to follow in His footsteps, to follow His example of compassion.

While Saint Matthew in his Gospel quotes our Lord as the great Lawgiver: "Be perfect as My heavenly Father is perfect." Saint Luke in his Gospel also quotes our Lord: "Be compassionate as my heavenly Father is compassionate." The art of caring for others, of giving aid and help to others, of being concerned about others, is the Christ-like art of compassion. It can be difficult at times, especially with our busy schedules. It can be draining a times, especially when it involves sharing in the emotional sorrow and pain of others.

Those of you who are good parents, know what compassionating with a sick child is all about. Those of you who are good spouses, know how to share and help carry the burdens of your spouse. Those of you who are good children, know how to visit and assist our elderly parents, even when such compassion requires much patience. Those of you who are good neighbors, know how to help out your neighbors when they are in need. Those of you who try to be good Catholics, good Christians, try to be alert to situations where we can show our love for Christ, by what we do for others.

At times we can be busy, but Jesus was busy too. At times we can be tired, but our Lord was tired at times as well. His heart went out to those in need and He reveals His compassionate side as God. And He calls us to be like Him in being compassionate towards others in our lives.

The main reason we gather every week is to partake in the Holy Eucharist, so as to be spiritually renewed and strengthened inwardly. And this inward renewal and strength should enable us, among other things, to be compassionate towards others.

Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the diocesan Web site. 
