

Jesus Always Sees Things As They Really Are

Jesus always sees things as they really are. While we have the ability to see things as we are, we can also pick and choose the bits of reality we are going to accept, the rest we just discard, or ignore, or deny. And so it may be easier for us to live our lives sort of blinded with a somewhat distorted and incomplete knowledge of ourselves, of others, and of God.

King David had a very interesting visit from the prophet Nathan who told him a story. A rich man with many sheep, slaughtered the only lamb of a poor neighbor in order to feed a guest. David was outraged and loudly condemned the rich man to all sorts of punishment. Nathan then revealed to David that he was, in fact, the rich man. He had taken Uriah's only wife as his own, although the king had many wives, and then made sure that Uriah would die in battle. David was shocked into seeing the evil he had committed. In shame and repentance and exclaimed: "I have sinned against the Lord".

David's sins of adultery and murder were terrible; but his honesty, humility and repentance before God was truly admirable. There are some Catholics who, because of their past sins, don't feel worthy to go to Church anymore. They need to learn the lesson King David learned. A lesson which even Saint Peter, who denied knowing Jesus, had learned.

What lesson is that? That repentance of sin destroys sin! That no one should ever despair or give up. Every time there is sin, there is also the possibility of repentance. Saint Paul sums this lesson up well when he says, "where sin abound, grace abounds more." God always welcomes and forgives a truly repentant person. Unlike some of us, our Lord never grows tired of forgiving a sinner who desires to change for the better. Our Lord told Saint Faustina, "*The bigger the sinner, the more right that person has to my mercy*".

In the Gospel today, the previously sinful woman who washed our Lord's feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair, and then anointed them with perfume, understood very well the concept of God's mercy. However, Simon the Pharisee who invited our Lord to his house for dinner was a person unacquainted with the need for God's mercy. Very gently our Lord speaks to Simon of human indebtedness to the Creator, of the reality of sin, of the need for forgiveness. Jesus is inviting Simon to see things as they really are. We don't know how Simon eventually responded to His words.

On one occasion our Lord said, "There is more joy in Heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine who have no need of repentance." Why? Because our Lord came to save! When His work of redemption takes root in a repentant heart, His suffering and death has born good fruit. Hence the joy of the Angels and Saints in heaven!

But Jesus also looks at each one of us and He knows us intimately. He knows our souls, for nothing is hidden from His gaze, and His gaze is still full of mercy. That same mercy He was able to give to King David and to the sinful woman, He offers to us as well! St. Isidore of Seville encourages the hesitant sinner: "Do not doubt, do not hesitate, never despair of the mercy of God."




