

Dear Brothers and Colleagues in the Vineyard:

May the Lord give you peace.

May I start by telling you all how grateful I am for your prayers and good wishes as I have tried to get my life put together with doctors and procedures and expert opinions in abundance. Divine Providence being what it is, God has provided resolution for all the crazy twists and turns I've been through this week. Contrary to popular stories, my health condition is not a secret; but it has been a mystery.

Now, this phase of the mystery is solved and I can tell you that I do, in fact need surgery. Believe it or not, at the beginning of the week this was debated matter. Now I can tell you that I will in fact have surgery on Wednesday 20 July. Your prayers will be most appreciated and needed.

I have high hopes to come home as soon as possible—but again: "Man proposes, but God disposes." So, I will wait and listen to doctors and all the others who will tell me what to do.

In all cases you will hear about progress and all the good things accomplished through modern medicine. You will be near and dear to my heart. God be with you.

#### God Will Take Good Care Of Us

"Ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." This is a promise that anyone would love to hear. With these words Jesus comforts and reassures us. He suggests that we will be satisfied and welcomed and fulfilled. His message in today's Gospel assures us that our heavenly Father loves us even more than earthly parents love their children. So we can enjoy the security of knowing that God will take good care of us.

But God's care may not always look exactly the way we expect it to. His care for us is based on knowing what is best for us and what will make us flourish. And, sometimes, what we think we need isn't really best. It's important to keep this context in mind. This prevents us from understanding Jesus' words today in a selfish way. As the end of the passage makes clear, this asking and seeking that Jesus refers to is ultimately fulfilled in the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus is promising us that if we ask God for his Spirit, he will certainly give it to us, his children.

For most of us, we actually received this gift at our baptism. But have we taken full advantage of this? Although we may not realize it at first, in receiving the Holy Spirit we actually receive a whole host of gifts. With God's Spirit come the sevenfold gifts of wisdom, understanding, counsel, knowledge, fortitude, piety, and fear of the Lord. And the fruits of the Spirit as St. Paul lists them in Galatians 5 include love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. God knows that all of these gifts and fruits make us very well equipped for life on earth, and for eternal life in heaven! What more do we really need to ask for?

#### WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question: My fiancé and I are very attached to a love song that we want to make the theme at our wedding. Could we use it at our wedding Mass?

Answer: Couples always want their wedding day to be special and they spend hours planning each detail. But the most important moment is the one when you exchange vows because the celebration of marriage is a celebration of a sacrament. The church, as a community of faith, witnesses your vows as you give yourselves to one another. The church recognizes and blesses your love for each other. For this reason, weddings are often done in the context of a Mass. Hearing the words of sacred Scripture and the offering of the sacrifice of Jesus surround the Rite of Marriage as the community of faith prays with and for you. Secular music, even that which celebrates love, is not appropriate for Mass. Liturgical music captures the theme and spirit of worship, uniting the prayers of the community in song. Since you are receiving a sacrament, you do not want to detract from that part of the celebration. Save any secular songs for your reception.




