Eternal Consequences

The rich man in today's Gospel lived in luxury. Yet, his sin was not that he was rich, but that he had misused the blessings of his wealth. He was totally self-absorbed, filled with self-love in the wrong way. We could call him: narcissistic.

In Greek mythology there was a young man named Narcissus, who looking at his reflection in a pool of water fell in love with his own reflection. Drawing closer to his image in the water he fell in and died by drowning. That is why we call people whose self-love goes in the wrong way, narcissistic.

The rich man in today's Gospel was narcissistic. He was so filled with self love in the wrong way that he had no love for others. He looked only at his own image and was blinded to the needs of others around him including Lazarus.

In our society, in our communities, and in our families, we can see those who are also blind to the needs of others: one's spouse, one's children, one's parents, one's neighbors. Sadly, they have become narcissistic. The Gospel and our Lord are very clear that it is good to be attentive to the needs of others. Being engaged in reaching out to others with acts of kindness and works of charity is something spiritual and emotionally healthy.

The Gospel and our Lord also makes it clear that our acts of kindness and works of charity do have eternal consequences, and that our good acts and works have true meaning in the light of eternity. Unfortunately, the same is also true concerning a person who lives narcissistic way of life.

The perverse atmosphere of selfishness, greed, lust, and self-indulgence can affect every one of us, even those of us who are struggling each day to be good Christians. Practicing acts of kindness and performing works of charity demands much at times, yet brings out the best in such a person. Christian acts of kindness and generosity also almost always brings with it a profound inner happiness.

Each one of us, has the capacity of expanding our hearts for other persons. And indeed, our Lord tells us that in the end, we will be judged on how much we have expanded our hearts to include others in His Name.

It's so easy to love the world, but it's hard to love the one sitting next to you! Only by God's grace are we able to expand our hearts. When was the last time you prayed that God may give you the grace to do so?




