The Solemnity of Christ the King

There is a quote which says: “If there is nothing above us, we will be consumed by all that is around us.” Our nation’s Founding Fathers recognized the truth of these words when they wrote that all are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. Our human dignity, rights and freedoms do not come to us from our President, our Congress or our Supreme Court, they come to us from above, from God our Creator.

Why did our nation’s independence become known as the American Experiment? Because in 1776 most people in the world were governed by kings and dictators, who ruled for the most part, as if the people were their possessions. Most rulers believed that the people belonged to them and not to God. Many millions of people in China and North Korea still live under such oppressive governments. The situation in our world was not much better in the early 20th century when rulers and dictators, who gave little thought to the inherent rights and dignity of people, eventually gave rise to World War I, Communism, Nazism and the horrors of World War II.

In 1925, Pope Pius XI saw this attempt by various governments to deny the divine rights and dignity given by God to the human person and so he established the Solemnity of Christ the King. As Christian Catholics we claim Jesus Christ to be our King. And Pope Pius was reminding every human person that Christ desires to establish His kingdom of truth within their hearts so it could be realized in the world. As Christians we are called to be “in this world, but not of this world.” We are not called to escape our world, nor are we to be enslaved by it, but we are called to sanctify it by our lives and by the choices we make.

As members of God's kingdom we are called by Christ the King to overcome hatred, deceit, injustice, immorality and all the other sins that cause so much evil in the world and in our own personal lives. The only way Christ’s kingdom can be revealed here on earth is through us by the way we live in our daily lives. However, if we do not accept Christ as our king then we can easily fall into unhealthy relationships with others and become overly attached to the things of this world. We in fact replace Christ the King with ourselves or become slaves to other people or things.

If we reject God as our Father and Christ as our King, then we will have betrayed our calling as Christians to ourselves and to others. Christ is our King precisely so that the unruly powers of our own hearts and of this world cannot ultimately hold us in their oppressive grip. Our freedom is found in being true sons and daughters of God Himself. If we claim Christ as our King then we will avoid being consumed by all that is around us.

What a blessing to know that our inherent rights and dignity come from God. And that we have been given this great truth to guide us how to live in this world, along with the teachings and example of Christ of King. May the good Lord give us the courage to live our lives according to this truth and the teachings of Christ our King!

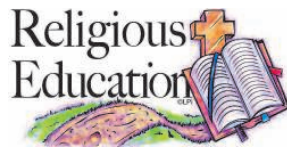

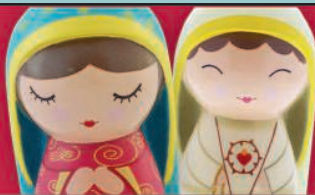
