### Holy Name of Jesus Catholic Parish - Established in 1946

Holy Name Parish was established in the 1940's to accommodate Catholic parishioners who lived west of the Wisconsin River. The Rev. Raymond Bornbach, administrator, received permission in April 1946 from Bishop McGavick to buy two lots on Ninth Avenue and Thomas Streets. The Rev. Lloyd Geissler became pastor in April 1947, and the following July rented the youth building at Marathon Park where Sunday Masses were celebrated until a church could be built. Three houses were purchased on two lots on South 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue – one house was used for a rectory/chapel, with the first Mass celebrated in the chapel on September 28, 1947.

Early in 1948, plans for a parochial school were approved by Bishop John P. Treacy. On Easter Sunday, April 1, 1949, Father Geissler celebrated the first Mass in the new school gym that also served as the temporary church. That September, of 1949, Holy Name of Jesus School opened with 562 students taught by twelve Sisters of the Divine Savior. This building is currently used for the Religious Education program, and the Youth Ministry offices.

In 1954, two lots were purchased for the Sisters' two-story brick, 18-bedroom convent, which was completed in May 1955. This building now serves as the rectory and parish offices.

Masses that were celebrated in the school gym quickly become over-crowded. On April 10, 1960, the Very Rev. Cletus Abts officiated at ground-breaking ceremonies for the new church and the cornerstone was laid July 30, 1960. The new church was designed to seat 850 parishioners. Father Abts celebrated the first Mass on March 5, 1961.

Holy Name has many vibrant and active groups and programs to serve our families, including the Catholic Crusaders Youth Group, St. Catherine's Council, Holy Name Society, Children's Sunday Liturgy, Bible Study groups, and Adult Religious Education. Our parish is very active in serving the community by serving meals at the Homeless Shelter, sponsoring the Circle of Joy Food Pantry, and mission trips to the Casa Hogar Orphanage in Peru, just to name a few. We invite you to visit our parish where you can *Believe...Be Loved... and Belong!* 



### God Speaks to us All

"And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart."

Supernatural communication was nothing new for Mary. The angel Gabriel had already appeared and spoken to her when she agreed to bear God's Son. Her husband Joseph also had a kind of divine intervention in the dream where the angel told him to go ahead and marry her. When she was first pregnant, her cousin Elizabeth had been led by the Holy Spirit to know the secret that Mary was "the mother of my Lord" (Lk 1:43). Now, Jesus has just been born and a crew of earthly shepherds appears at her door with a message from heaven: that the Savior has been born. And Mary believed them. She did not doubt their sincerity or the authenticity of their message. She took the words to heart, and meditated upon the meaning of it all.

What might strike us as peculiar in all of this is that God chose to speak to Mary in a variety of ways. This holy and immaculate woman, this Mother of God, did not always receive direct communication from on high. Sometimes, God chose to speak to her through other people. Sometimes, he revealed himself to them in order to reveal himself to her. And God does the same with us.

It's easy to daydream about having our own personal revelation from God, to hear his voice loud and clear, directing, encouraging, and supporting us in our times of need and confusion. But this isn't the standard pattern of God's operation. Mary was tuned in enough to hear God's voice all around her instead of expecting it to always sound the same. We can imitate this same kind of openness by seeking to discover how God may be speaking to us through the voices of others.


