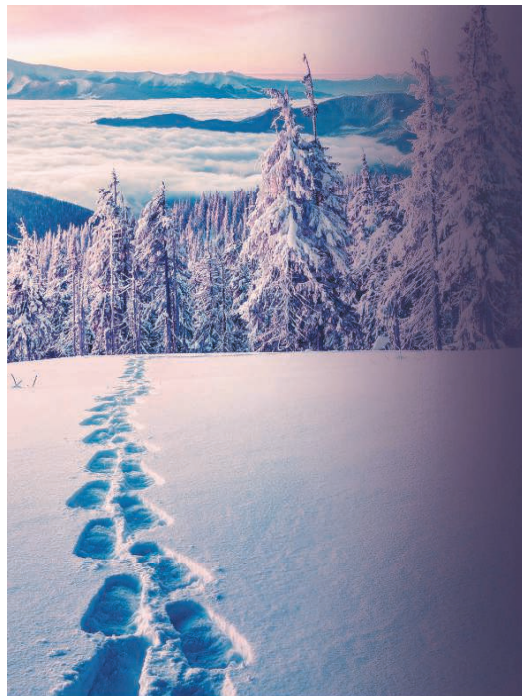

“Behold the Lamb of God”

Notice in the gospel this weekend where John the Baptist is like a sign-post standing with two of his disciples, Andrew and John, and sees Jesus and says, ‘*Behold the Lamb of God*’. John points away from himself to Jesus. Why? Well, as the prologue of St John’s Gospel says, ‘so that all might believe’.

Let us look more closely at this unique Lamb of God title which is appropriate only for Jesus. The Fourth Gospel has rich imagery, drawing on many Old Testament themes, one of which is the “*Lamb of God*”. For the Jews, this would resonate with the sacrifices of the Temple in Jerusalem. An unblemished lamb was offered every morning and evening as a sacrifice, and the great annual festival of Passover required a lamb to be slain. And, in the Servant songs of Isaiah, we have the picture of the one led like a lamb to the slaughter, who mysteriously bore the sins of many.

Saint John the Evangelist is drawing on these Old Testament images of these types of lambs, but adds to them: ‘*who takes away the sin of the world*’. This introduces further imagery, as well as Isaiah 53, which refers to a scapegoat; a live goat upon whose head the Jewish High Priest, on the Day of Atonement, would place all the sins of the past year, of the Jewish people. This goat would then be driven away out into the wilderness, as a sign that God in his mercy had removed far away the sins of the people.

The Passover lamb had nothing to do with sin, but it was to do with the ideas of deliverance and rescue, of freedom from slavery. John’s Gospel states that Jesus was slain at the very time that the Passover lambs were being killed in the Temple. Jesus is the true Passover Lamb, through whom we receive deliverance, salvation, and freedom from slavery. And for Saint John the Evangelist, if we are to have life, if we are to be truly free, then sin has to be dealt with. Jesus is the one whose death for all humanity deals with sin and so enables every person to receive life.

The people of Saint John’s times were looking for a Messiah who would be a mixture of a mighty King, a holy prophet, a fierce warrior. John introduced us to a lamb, but a very unique lamb, which would conquer far more than the Roman Empire. This would be the Lamb offered up on Calvary to take away the sins of all humanity, the Lamb which would bring about the redemption of fallen humanity.

These words, “*Behold the Lamb of God*” are precious words in our Eucharistic Liturgy. We hear them first in the *Gloria*: “*Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us.*” Then we have the *Agnus Dei* hymn, which was first introduced into the Mass in the seventh century, and was sung just before communion. This hymn addresses Christ, who is now sacramentally present on the altar.

‘*Behold the Lamb of God*’. May our worship and music during Mass point us to Jesus, as in thanksgiving we acclaim and receive Him as the One who takes away the sins of the world, as the One who gives us life.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question:

Why do we baptize infants when the Bible says "repent and be baptized"? How can an infant repent?

Answer:

When you take a trip, you do not wait until you run out of gas before you fill the tank--at least not on purpose! You fill your tank and pack your bags as you anticipate a trouble-free journey. We can make a similar case for the baptism of children as they begin their spiritual journey. In the early church, only adults were baptized when they professed faith in Jesus as the Messiah. As the church grew, children were baptized and raised in faith. The Bible does not limit baptism to adults. Several passages point to infant baptism. Jesus said, "Let the children come to me and do not hinder them," while Paul would baptize people "and their household." He did not limit baptism to adults. Ultimately, our whole life is an act of repentance, a continual struggle to turn from sin and be faithful to the Gospel. We believe that baptism is more than a symbolic act of faith. It forgives original sin as well as personal sin, and brings us into the church, where we begin our journey of faith.

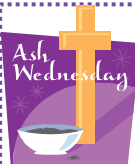
