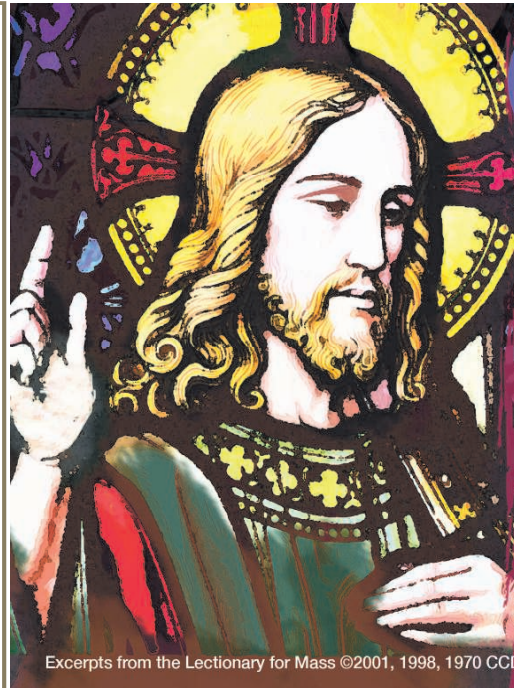

## What Does It Mean That Jesus Came to Fulfill Scripture?

When Jesus said that he came to “*fulfill the law and the prophets*,” he meant it - literally. He came to fulfill the scriptures with Himself. For about 200 years the scribes and Pharisees had been the go-to experts on how to read the Sacred Scriptures of the Old Testament. Jesus however, offered a new way of keeping the Sacred Scriptures by fulfilling it. What did that mean? Well, right away tensions rose, and the Pharisees began accusing Jesus of playing fast and loose with the Word of God.

It is ironic, if one thinks about it. The Living Word of God, who is Jesus, is standing before these Pharisees and Scribes, who accuse Jesus of misrepresenting the written Word of God! To address their accusations Jesus said, “*Amen, I say to you . . . not the smallest letter will pass from the law . . .*” This phrase may not seem like much to us today, but in Jesus’ day it was His way of claiming absolute personal authority over interpreting the written words of the Sacred Scriptures.

What exactly did Jesus mean by fulfilling the law and the prophets? The story of Pinocchio may be of some help. We are all familiar with puppet-boy Pinocchio, who was jerked around on the strings that controlled his life. Yet during the story Pinocchio undergoes a transformation. No more strings. Life had somehow gotten inside of Pinocchio. Without Jesus, the Sacred Word of God can become a book with many strings. But with Jesus, the Sacred Word of God is fulfilled. The sacred words of God can enter within us and bring us to a new way of living!

The Pharisees and Scribes had become all tangled up in the various strings they had created. Jesus came into the world to cut those types of man-made strings of external conformity to allow His Living Word to enter within us, so we can live by His truth and grace. Do you want to be pulled around by the external strings of your own untamed desires, peer pressure, irrational fear, and anxiety? Or would you rather be filled with the Living Word of God?

The Words of Sacred Scripture need to be understood in the light of the teachings of Jesus; He entrusted to His Church. Notice in each instant of the Gospel today that Our Lord demands a much higher form of virtue and holiness coming from the heart, than the Pharisees or Scribes did in external observance. Jesus confirmed the teaching not to murder, and not to be unjustly angry. He concurred that one should not commit adultery, or lust in the heart. He not only condemned the divorce of a valid marriage, nor could you remarry if your marriage was valid. He agreed that it was wrong to take a false oath, but He went on to state that without grave and right reasons, we should take no oath at all.

We Christians are called to understand the written Word of God through Jesus. He is the Living Word made flesh, God’s love made visible. Every Biblical teaching is to be pondered and understood through His teachings. A good question for each one of us is, are we Pinocchio before or after his transformation? We get to choose.

### WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

#### **Question:**

I read in the catechism that marriage is indissoluble. Why then does the church issue an annulment?

#### **Answer:**

The description of marriage as indissoluble is found in several places in the "Catechism of the Catholic Church." Described as required by spousal love (#1644) and as foundational to the union of marriage (#1646), this quality of marriage draws its meaning from the fidelity of Jesus to his church (#1647). Spouses give themselves once and forever to each other, forming a sacramental bond that binds them as one. Indissolubility presumes and depends upon the sacramental bond between spouses. An annulment does not destroy the bond. Instead, it shows that a sacramental bond never took place because, at the time of the vows, something was either present or absent that made the consent invalid. The ceremony itself does not bring about a sacrament, but rather the full, free, and able consent of a man and woman, one to the other. The husband and wife are the ministers of the sacrament to each other because they give the gift of themselves to one another. The priest is the official witness. Therefore, if the gift of self is not given, or is held back for any reason, no sacrament takes place.

#### **Question:**

After a civil divorce, is a Catholic obligated to pursue an annulment ?

#### **Answer:**

Many Catholics are not exactly sure what an annulment does. An annulment does not deny that a marriage took place, nor does it deny that there once was love. It does not mean that people say anything untrue, such as they never loved each other or that everything in their marriage was wrong. An annulment does not negate children, nor make them illegitimate. An annulment addresses the spiritual aspect of marriage. In effect, an annulment says that at the time of the wedding, there was either something present or something absent that prevented the sacrament from taking place. It is a spiritual determination that, if granted in the affirmative, allows a person to marry in the church.

Annulments have no legal standing and are unable to be used in a civil court. Therefore, a Catholic has no moral obligation to pursue an annulment. However when the tragedy of a divorce occurs, and there is no hope for reconciliation, annulments may help bring some spiritual closer to a persons life. Some people have found the process to be healing and others have found it to be difficult. Speak to your priest or a member of the Diocesan Tribunal staff to decide what is best for you.

## NEWS FROM HELPING HANDS

Helping Hands volunteers have returned from their humanitarian trip to Kenya, Africa. We accomplished much; 6 homes were built, 3 hospital rooms were tiled and painted, 7 schools were visited and projects done with the children, house kits were purchased and distributed to 25 families, water tanks, beds/mattresses, and blankets were also purchased and distributed to families. The most rewarding part of the trip was interacting with the people. They are happy and faith-filled people who teach us so much about living each day by the strength they get from their faith.

We have been helping 7 Maasai villages over the last 3 years. On this trip we found out there is a need to help educate their children. There was a time when only one child (a boy) from a family went to school, but they now see the need for education and want all their children (boys & girls) to attend. The cost of education is a challenge for most of the Maasai. To send a child to school for one year is \$150.00, this includes, uniform, shoes, lunch and tuition.
