

### Spiritual Rebirth: The Samaritan Woman at the Well

The woman at the well is an unhappy woman because of her poor choices. Her name was Photina, she had two sons, Joseph and Victor. She was married five times and was living with a man who wasn't her husband. And her unfortunate situation was well known throughout the area.

Though our Lord makes clear that people should not live in sin, we see Him gently leading this woman to a deeper self-respect for herself and a deeper awareness of that inner longing within her, to put things right in her relationship with God. It's a story of how an open heart can allow a soul, dried up and parched by sin and inner torment, to be refreshed by the living water of God's grace.

We are familiar with the picture of Jesus knocking on a door without a doorknob to show us that while Jesus knocks on the door of our hearts, as He was with Photina, we have to be the ones that open the door to allow His words and His grace to touch our hearts.

Our Lord comes with His words and His grace to save the spiritually sick and to help those who need inner healing. Photina went to the well to get a jug of water. Instead, she got the spiritual Living Water of God's cleansing mercy which cleansed and refreshed her spiritual life.

And because her heart was open to God's grace, she was now spiritually renewed and hastened to do the work of an apostle by telling the townsfolk the good news of her conversion. The townsfolk received the news with joy and begged Jesus to stay a while. Their hearts were also open to the truth, and they too were willing to be taught.

Soon afterwards Photina and her two sons left that place and went to live in Carthage in northern Africa where they could begin a new life as good Christians. After thirty years they along with the other Christians in Carthage were arrested and taken to Rome during the reign of the Emperor Nero, and after some months in prison they were put to death.

Photina became Saint Photina and the Byzantine Mass uses the following Hymn on her feast day to honor her:

By the well of Jacob, O holy one, you found the Living Water. of eternal and blessed life; and having partaken thereof
O wise Photina,
You went forth proclaiming Christ, the Anointed One.

### WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

### **Ouestion:**

What can I do to keep up the spirit and practice of Lent in my life?

### Answer:

Lent is an intense retreat, a forty-day period of reflection and penance that prepares us to celebrate the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ. Our communication with God and our awareness of him is the purpose of prayer. Setting aside extra time each day helps intensify the season. Prayer includes daily Mass, Stations of the Cross, communal penance services, and private confession. Making restitution for sin as well as disciplining our hearts and minds to focus on God is the purpose of penance. It helps us restore a sense of balance to our souls, thrown out of kilter by sin. Penance includes personal sacrifice, self-denial, fasting, almsgiving, and charitable works. Finally, spiritual practices help us sharpen our understanding and insight into the meaning and understanding of our faith. When you take your faith seriously, you do what is necessary to follow Jesus more closely, to integrate your life and your faith more carefully.



### Religious Ed Lenten Giving Class to Class Challenge


Students have started to bring in their donations. The challenge the year is to exceed last year's \$400.


