Passion Sunday commemorates the last week of Jesus' life on earth.

During the First Reading from the Gospel of Luke, we heard of the entry of Jesus in Jerusalem on a colt. During this event, His disciples appeared to recognize the Divine Person of Jesus as their King. So important was this event that when the Pharisees asked Jesus to order His disciples to stop saying, "*Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!*" Jesus responded by saying that if His disciples were silent, "*the stones would shout out.*" This would not go unnoticed by His enemies.

And while Jesus was proclaimed as the King of the people during His entry into Jerusalem, on the following Friday, many of the same people, would be shouting, "*Crucify, crucify him!*" Why the sudden change of heart? It was because the people, who were waiting for the promised Messiah and the coming Kingdom of God, were expecting a worldly kingdom. They were tired of the Romans who were ruling over them. They wanted Jesus as their King to lead them to war against the Roman Empire in order to end their dominion. Many of the people had failed to understand that His Kingdom superseded the political order of this world.

As we continued with the Gospel reading we know that Jesus is crucified. Perhaps some were hoping that at the last minute, the angels would descend from Heaven, and Jesus would come down from the cross stronger than ever and overthrow the Roman power in Judea. None of this happened. Jesus, as the Lamb of God, spotless and without sin, died in His human flesh for the sins of each and every one of us.

Today's reading from the Letter of Paul to the Philippians tells us that, Jesus "*though He was in the form of God, He did not regard equality with God as something to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, He humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.*"

Through the deception of Satan, death, sin and sorrow entered into the world. Through the perfect sacrifice of Jesus, life, holiness and joy once again came upon the world. Therefore God highly exalted Jesus and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

This week, let us reflect upon the mystery of the Passion of Jesus, our King, as we prepare ourselves to commemorate His glorious Resurrection. Let us remember that Jesus died for our sins. Let us be most thankful to the Lord Jesus in our thoughts, words and actions. And may the Spirit of Jesus be with us during the coming week as we relive the last few days in the life of Jesus on earth. This is a perfect opportunity for us to learn about Divine love, so that we too may grow in love for God and others as we strive to imitate His love for us.

Yet Jesus remains faithful and accepts the fate that is before him. In all of this, he never wavers from the truth and continues to speak of mercy, forgiveness, and a God who loves. When life gets the best of us and brings us to our knees, can we remain faithful to the truth and accept what we cannot control?
