

Good Shepherd Sunday

President Franklin D. Roosevelt had the feeling that no one was really listening to the usual pleasantries at all those White House receptions. So, one evening he planned a test to find out. As each person came up to him with extended hand, he flashed that big smile and said, "I murdered my grandmother this morning." How did people respond? With automatic unthinking responses: "How lovely!" or "Just continue with your great work!" Nobody truly listened to what he was saying, except one foreign diplomat. When the president said, "I murdered my grandmother this morning," the diplomat responded softly, "I'm sure she had it coming." While all heard his voice, only one person was actually listening.

We have experienced this as well: parents with children who are fidgety; wives or husbands with their spouses who are preoccupied; Teachers with students who are daydreaming; Priests with people in the pews who are distracted. And we can also do this to our Lord, when we are fidgety, preoccupied, daydreaming or distracted when He is calling us to follow Him.


You know, lambs do not know their shepherd's voice, only the more mature sheep do. Each shepherd had a peculiar way of speaking to the sheep that allowed them to know that he was their shepherd. That is why a group of shepherds could corral many flocks together into one pen and then the next morning call their own sheep with their unique voice. We remain lambs, when we refuse to grow spiritually by refusing to become true listeners of Jesus and His teachings. And if we remain spiritually immature like lambs, we will become difficult to distinguish between the voice of Our Lord and the voice of others who would lead us down a destructive path in life. We need to learn how to listen to the voice of Jesus so that we can recognize His voice above other voices. Good listeners will grow spiritually in their Catholic faith as they listen, reflect and absorb the teachings of the Good Shepherd.

When we fail to follow someone's good advice and mess things up we say, "I should have listened to so and so!" And we can become confused in life if we only hear voices without discerning, without truly listening, when such voices tell us to give in to our passions and anger, lie, cheat, steal, do drugs, live together before marriage, etc.

I'll conclude with the words of Saint Agatha after she was arrested for being a Christian: "Jesus Christ, Lord of all things! You see my heart, You know my desire, for I am Your sheep." May each one of us honestly be able to say the same thing!

World Day of Prayer will be observed on Sunday, May 7th, also known as "Good Shepherd Sunday."

The purpose of this day is to publically fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). Please pray that young men and women hear and respond generously to the Lord's call to the priesthood, diaconate, and religious life, societies of apostolic life or secular institutes. Question:

Our pastor recently mentioned the need for Deacons. It is something I am considering. How do I know if I have a vocation? What steps should I take next?


Answer:

Any and all gifts that the Holy Spirit gives to the church are for the good of the community. As members of the body of Christ, what one member does affects all; what the body does also affects each member. A vocation or call to ministry is tested and verified by the church. Through prayer, instruction, and service, a vocation is tested, and then acknowledged by the official call to orders or to service. If you are considering becoming a Deacon, the first step would be to talk to your Pastor. He will be able to give you more specific information on the program in your diocese, what is expected of you, and how you apply. You might also begin to see a spiritual director, someone who can help you with your faith journey and vocation discernment. They do so by focusing on prayer, your relationship with God, and spiritual practices. Finally, you'll need to see the diocesan vocation director in charge of deacons to apply. Best wishes!
