I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life

We have all heard something like, "As long as you believe in God and try to be a good person, it doesn't matter what religion you belong to," or "there are different paths up the mountain, but they all lead to the summit." It's politically correct, tolerant and sounds very reasonable. However, Jesus says such thinking is wrong when He categorically states, "I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father but by me."

The way to heaven had been closed for centuries. God did not set up the road block. It was Adam and Eve with Original Sin, and us with our own personal sins, that did. Such barriers were immovable for us. God was the only one who could open the way, and He did so through His Son.

People in the ancient world had some ideas about a divine being or beings. But their ideas were shadowy and fragmentary and mixed with distortions. In general, they knew a divine being, or beings, had created the universe, and worship of such divine beings was a duty. But their worship was often strange and sometimes even appalling, including human sacrifice. People also projected upon these divine beings human traits of both virtues and vices.

Jesus, as a Divine Being with a divine nature, assumed to Himself a human nature. By doing so He becomes a very unique way, indeed He becomes a two way street. In Him, God comes to us with His saving grace and through Him we have access to the truth about God. Jesus is God's definitive and perfect Word, expressing who God is and what He is like. And Jesus is the life. He gives us not only commandments and noble truths to live by, but also the power to live them out, and the power to become a new creation. By becoming like us in all things but sin, we come to understand the good that we are also capable of doing as adopted children of His heavenly Father.

Jesus alone is the Way, the Truth, and the Life, and the Good News is that once we have been baptized, there is no longer a separation between us and Him. When we are baptized into Him, we become members of His body, and He is able to live His life through us. If we let Him, He will use our lives to show the way of goodness, our lips to spread His truth, and our life to give life to others. But the greatest work that He will be able to accomplish within us, is to teach us to be willing to offer our own lives to the Father through Him, and with Him, and in Him. For the true meaning of human life is found in Christ, as He is the Way, the Truth and the Life of every human person.
