Are you afraid to meet Jesus?

The Gospel Reading of today tells both of Jesus' immanent departure and His promise of the Holy Spirit. The disciples are sad at hearing that He will be leaving them. But our Lord promises to send them the Advocate, the Spirit of truth who will live in the hearts of Christians to console and to guide them. 'Advocate' is a translation of the Greek word 'Paraclete' and it carries a range of meanings: Counselor, Comforter, Helper, Intercessor, and Strengthener. It literally means 'one called alongside to help' whenever necessary. In other words, our Lord tells His disciples that they will never be alone. The Holy Spirit will always be with them to counsel them, to defend them, to intercede for them, and to comfort them.

Sadly, many in the world do not recognize the Holy Spirit. The 'world' here represents all those who live only for themselves, who see everyone else and everything else as stepping stones to their own advancement, their own pleasure and enjoyment. Such people are unfortunately deaf to the Holy Spirit and the peace He could give to their hearts.

However, those who follow Jesus and His teachings do recognize the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit will help them to see the way they should go, the relationships that need to be repaired, and will help them in the other important areas of their life. As Christians we are called to be a people of hope. That is one of our distinguishing marks. But do I see myself as person of hope? Is my hope based on the Resurrection of Jesus and the promises He made to His followers?

There is a touching story which reveals the power of the Holy Spirit in consoling and guiding both a father and his dying son. It involves an eight year old boy named Michael who had become very ill. After a series of tests, his parents were told the shocking news that their son had a terminal illness with only a few days to live. Michael, being the youngest of five children, grew up in a faith-filled family who was active in their parish and saw weekly Mass as an important part of their spiritual life. Michael had received his First Holy Communion the year before.

The father wondered how he would have the strength to tell his son that he would die very soon and would be with Jesus. After praying in the hospital chapel, he went to the boy's bedside with a heavy heart. Then he gently told him that he only had a few more days to live. The father then asked his son, "*Michael, are you afraid to meet Jesus*?" Blinking away a few tears, the little fellow said bravely, "*No, not if He is like you, Dad!*"

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Ouestion:

How do we know when we receive the Holy Spirit?

Answer:

My brothers and I discovered something as we got older. There's a little bit of Dad in us. Each time we catch ourselves using one of his gestures, expressions, or comments about a meal, we say, "I'm getting more like Dad!" When we are confirmed, we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit. There is no radical change in us that makes us seem suddenly different. Over a period of time we come to see that there is a little bit of the Spirit in us. We catch ourselves using the gifts, and often end up wondering where a bit of wisdom came from, why we were so patient, or we feel an intensity in our prayer. Perhaps we felt drawn to deepen our spiritual life or found courage in witnessing to our faith. That's when we know we have received the Holy Spirit. We take on his image. Yes, we grow in age, grace, and wisdom, but we also grow in our awareness and understanding of the working of God in our life-we realize we're getting more and more like God. Our thoughts, words, and actions carry that quality and others also see it in us. You might call it holiness. But be confident-there's a little bit of God in all of us!




