HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY

Saint Augustine writes that "two parents have conceived us for death, and two parents have conceived us for life." Most Catholics could easily identify Adam and Eve as the two parents, who conceived us for death because by their original sin they brought sickness and death into the world. Saint Augustine identifies the two parents who have conceived us for life as the Blessed Trinity and the Church. He goes on to say they these two "Parents" have given us supernatural life! The Church we can somehow see as our Mother. But how can we relate to the Blessed Trinity at all?

The shamrock was originally chosen as the national emblem of Ireland because Saint Patrick used this three leaf clover to explain the Blessed Trinity. Three distinct Divine Persons yet united in one Divine Nature. True Catholic theology recognizes in each of the Divine Persons a type or kind of Father. Not Father, as a human father. Just as the Church is Mother, is not the same as our human mother, but there is a similarity. God is divine and infinite and therefore we have to be careful not to project a human family image onto the reality of this unique spiritual family composed of the Trinity, the Church and us.

In Genesis, matter is presented as the maternal reality in relation to the Holy Trinity: God the Father as the Creator; God the Holy Spirit as the *Ruah* or Breath of God; and God the Son as the Word of God. Together as one they act upon this matter in such a way that a variety of life forms were created.

This divine pattern of the work of Holy Trinity is repeated, at the Annunciation. At the Annunciation, The Holy Virgin Mary represents the maternal reality in relation to the Holy Trinity. God the Father announces through Gabriel His plan to Mary. God the Holy Spirit overshadows the Holy Virgin, and God the Son is conceived in her virginal womb.

Again, this divine pattern is seen at the Baptism of our Lord. The Waters of the Jordan take on the maternal reality in relation to the Holy Trinity. God the Father's voice was heard, and God the Holy Spirit descended upon God the Son in a visible form, and from then on all water has the capacity of generating new children of God through the Sacrament of Baptism.

Finally, this divine pattern is repeated in our own spiritual life with the Church as our Mother, nourishing us with the Sacraments through the wisdom and power of the Blessed Trinity. God the Father sends the Son, and together the Father and the Son send the Holy Spirit to sanctify each and every one of us who are children of the Church.

I will conclude with the words of St. John of Damascus: "I worship one God, but I adore three Persons: God the Father, God the Son made flesh, and God the Holy Spirit. Amen."
