

THE SOLEMNITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI From a sermon by Saint Gaudentius, bishop of Brescia 387-410

The heavenly sacrifice, instituted by Christ, is the most gracious legacy of His new covenant. On the night He was delivered up to be crucified He left us this gift as a pledge of His abiding presence. This sacrifice is our sustenance on life's journey; by Holy Communion we are nourished and supported along the road of life until we depart from this world and make our way to the Lord. For this reason He addressed these words to us: *Unless you eat my Flesh and drink my Blood, you will not have life in you.*

It was the Lord's will that His gifts should remain with us and that we who have been redeemed by His precious Blood should constantly be sanctified according to the pattern of His own passion. And so He commanded His apostles whom He made the first priests of His Church to enact these mysteries of eternal life throughout the centuries. All priests throughout the Catholic churches of the world must celebrate these mysteries until Christ comes again from heaven. Therefore let us all, priests and people alike, be faithful to participating in Eucharistic Sacrifice of our redemption. Daily it is before our eyes as a representation of the passion of Christ. We hold the Eucharist in our hands, we receive it in our mouths, and we accept it in our hearts.

It is appropriate that we should receive the Body of Christ in the form of bread, because, as there are many grains of wheat in the flour from which bread is made by mixing it with water and baking it with fire, so also we know that many members make up the one body of Christ which is brought to maturity by the fire of the Holy Spirit. Similarly, Blood of Christ is drawn from the many grapes of the vineyard that He had planted, and is extracted in the winepress of the cross. When one receives His Sacred Blood with believing hearts, like expanding wineskins, it changes that person from within by its own power.

And so, now that you have escaped from the power of sin and the devil, join with us, all of you, in receiving this sacrifice in Holy Communion with the eagerness of dedicated hearts. Then in our inmost being we shall be wholly sanctified by the very Lord Jesus Christ whom we believe to be present in His Sacraments, and whose boundless power abides for ever.

Newman Catholic Schools Education Commission Minute Summary for 2 May 2017

Present: a. Frs. Thorn, Schaller, Burkhardt, Slowiak, Thelen, Kuhn. Parish Representatives: Berine Ford, Steve Opatik, Jeni Seidel, Rick Svennes, Margee McCarty, Lori Manteufel. b. Committee Chairs: Mike Vesel, Paul David, Mike Nowinski. c. Ex-officio, Mike Martin, Sarah Keene, S Evers, P Thompson, M King. d. Guests: Lori and Sean Bennett, Jacci Lepak, Ann McManus, Dan Sullivan, Tina Meyer

- 01. The parish contribution to Newman Catholic Schools is \$1.5 million annually. Fr. Slowiak pointed out that the revised diocesan investment formula of 2104 incorporates, for Newman Catholic High School, support from parishes in the deanery who do not fund a parish school. This will be part of the \$1.5 million investment and not add additional dollars to the NCS budget from the parishes.
- 02. Committee Reports were reviewed from Advancement, Athletics Committee, Facilities. Fr. Slowiak invited the pastors to consider establishing a Buildings and Grounds Committee for the NCS Middle and High building.
- 03. President's report: a. WPCP (Wisconsin Parental Choice Program) . . . can include 1% to 2% of area students. Eligible for enrollment in WPCP are students K-12 at \$7500 per student to NCS. Fr. Burkhardt noted that the NCS budget cannot be dependent on the WPCP. Per Bishop Callahan we are to be earmarking said funds for capital development not the operating budget. b. The Newman Endowment Committee committed funds to the request of the president to hire a Director of Instruction. c. NCS has contracted with Dr. Klosinski to write a DOI (Department of Instruction) posting. d. Licensed Child Care and the Young Star ratings: The Early Childhood Centers at Sts. Therese and Michael Parishes are just short of the Five Star rating because of a credential issue. Accredited by AdvancEd, the sites will automatically obtain a five star rating when said requirements are met. We have waiting lists in all of the classes. NCS is in discussion with Sts. Michael and Therese Parishes about the use of additional classrooms. e. The NCES: St. Mark Home and School will incorporate the Child Development Center: St Therese next year. f. Confirmed enrollments for 2017-18: St Mark has five additional students in 4K and 10 additional students above this year, St. Michael has 42 4K students. St. Anne is expecting 200.
- 04. Strategic Planning. a. Partners in Ministry (PIM) representative, Kathleen Casey will meet with the commission on 6 June to open Strategic Planning initiative. Fr. Burkhardt noted, "Do we understand what is being asked for in strategic planning? We need to know our roles because this group may be asked to answer the questions to all stakeholders. Communication and the process of each group must be understood." The goal to have the plan submitted to the Dean by the summer of 2018.
- 05. Education Commission. a. We need to make clear the expectations of education commission members and how to engage parish feedback. b. The agenda and committee minutes need to be in the hands of members 7-10 days prior to the meeting in order to provide time to read, process and be able to contribute.
- 06. The pastors reached consensus that the NCS Graduation will include prayer and Scripture per a handout. Second, the NCS Baccalaureate will be celebrated at St. Mark's this year and rotate among the parishes, St. Therese, next year.


