I was ordained to the “transitional diaconate” in August of 1998, right after I graduated from Theology. As a Capuchin Franciscan, I was required to spend 9 months at a parish run by the Capuchins to prepare me for ordination to the priesthood. I was assigned to St. Mary’s in Marathon City.

Fr. Joe Diermeier was a great mentor. We got along very well and he helped me get over some of my initial jitters that accompany this powerful ministry. The following May (15th) I was ordained to the priesthood in Mount Calvary, Wisconsin.

The province originally wanted me to spend a year as an associate at St. Mary’s and then go to the Capuchin missions in Panama. I was quite happy to do that at the time. However, as the next year drew to a close I began to discover how much I liked being back in Wisconsin. I had spent several years overseas prior to joining the Capuchins and it was good to be home. At the same time, some people from St. Joseph Parish in Prescott, Wisconsin, were inviting me to be their pastor. They wanted to have a Capuchin pastor because it was the church where Fr. Solanus Casey, OFM Cap was baptized. (Pope Francis announced recently that Fr. Solanus will be declared Blessed near the end of this year.) I decided I wasn’t ready for the responsibility and turned down the offer.

I requested and received approval to stay at St. Mary’s for another year, and even the year after that. Then in May of 2002 Fr Diermeier and I both left the Capuchins and were “incardinated” into the Diocese of La Crosse.

The experience of being an associate pastor at St. Mary’s was wonderful. Fr. Diermeier gave me free rein and I was able to get to know the parishioners there very well. Besides celebrating Masses, hearing confessions, and preaching, I visited the sick and homebound, taught seventh grade religion at St. Mary’s grade school, and visited parishioners. It was a great experience. I fell in love with the people at St. Mary’s and was loved by them. This was an experience I wanted to pass onto Fr. Dan.

For the people at Holy Name this was the first time in many, many years that they had a newly ordained priest as an associate pastor. The parishioners of St. Matthew had newly ordained Fr. Hector Moreno as associate pastor back in 2005.

I wanted to make sure Fr. Dan’s experience of the priesthood his first two years was positive and nurturing, so I gave him free rein. He had plenty of time to get to know the parishioners of each parish, visit the homebound, the sick, go to the hospital and nursing homes, etc., and he used it very well. And his wonderful demeanor touched everyone who knew him.

What a great experience it was for all. You formed Fr. Dan into a good priest, and he will continue to be formed by the parishioners at his new assignment. It never stops. There’s always more to learn, and new experiences that mold and shape the nature of a priest’s ministry, preaching, and interaction with parishioners.

Thank you everyone for making this such a great experience for Fr. Dan. I am sure you will do the same with soon to be “Fr.” Peter Kieffer, who will join us for two years beginning next week.

"Even all the hairs of your head are counted. So do not be afraid." Can it really be true? Is our heavenly Father actually so aware of us? Does the Creator of the universe pay that much attention to ME? Jesus says yes. God knows us far more intimately than we even know ourselves. And so, we have nothing to fear.

Being Christian isn't guaranteed to be easy. More and more in our own culture, following the faith is being criticized and discouraged in the public square. Privately, we may struggle with the demands of the commandments or the ability to believe when we face the inevitable trials that come our way. But passages like this one in today's Gospel are a source of tremendous hope and consolation. We are LOVED beyond measure. We enjoy the care and concern of God in every situation, big and small. Truly we have no need to worry or be anxious because God is in control.

For our part, of course, Jesus asks us to trust him and stay faithful. He asks us not to apologize for our faith, especially publicly. "Everyone who acknowledges me before others, I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father." When we live our faith with confidence, it's a way of accepting the power and providence of God. But when we try to hide our faith away because we're afraid of causing problems, we only damage our relationship with the One who can actually solve them.

At the end of the day, the only really serious problem we need to worry about is losing our soul--and that, to be sure, is up to us. As the great French novelist Léon Bloy wrote, "There is only one tragedy in the end: not to have been a saint."

This two-week period is a time when our liturgical calendar celebrates a series of great martyrs who remained faithful in the face of persecution by political power, including St. Thomas More and St. John Fisher, St. John the Baptist, Sts. Peter and Paul and the First Martyrs of the Church of Rome.

The theme of this year's "Fortnight for Freedom" is Freedom for Mission. The theme seeks to complement the USCCB-hosted Convocation of Catholic Leaders, which includes a focus on missionary discipleship and will take place in Orlando from July 1 to July 4. We are called to follow Christ as missionary disciples by seeking the truth, serving others and living our faith in all that we do.

PRAYER FOR RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

Almighty and good God, Father of all Creation, we thank you for placing deep within us the Divine attribute of freedom and giving us a longing for it in our daily lives. In history the founders of our great nation enshrined religious freedom as our highest liberty. 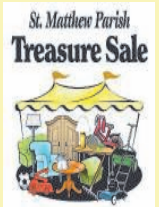

Couples Preparing to Celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage

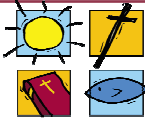

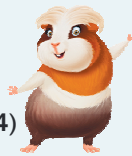
