Come and Rest in Jesus

In our Gospel today Jesus says, "Come to me all you who labor and are overburdened, and I will give you rest." We all need rest and spiritual renewal. That's why it's a good thing to relax and do something fun and enjoyable during the summer and around the holidays throughout the year.

While vacations and time spent at family gatherings are refreshing for mind and body, our soul also needs to be refreshed from time to time as well. Why not consider going on a pilgrimage or retreat once or twice a year or attending daily Mass when possible? Persons who go on a retreat or make a pilgrimage to a Catholic Shrine or some special church, usually return back to their normal life spiritually refreshed, experiencing an inner peace that the world cannot give us.

Jesus invites us all to come to Him, especially when we are weary and overburdened in life, and He will give us rest. Exercise, sports and wholesome music can, and often do, help us feel better and more relaxed in a natural way. Yet, time spent in prayer, in holy places, outdoors amid God's creation, or in a special place in one's own home can be a source of renewal for our spiritual life.

The sad fact is, if we ignore the need for spiritual renewal in our lives, we run the risk of becoming spiritually weak and sick and may even neglect a relationship with God. Spending some time in prayer each day not only helps to maintain the spiritual dimension of our life, but also instinctively turns us to the Lord in prayer when a difficulty or crisis comes upon us.

I worked in a retreat center for four years that had fourteen cabins spread throughout 150 acres of woods. While many priests and religious would come there – many, many more lay people – young, old, married and single would spend one or two weeks there reestablishing or strengthening the spiritual dimension of their lives. They were offered daily Mass, confession and Eucharistic Adoration.

I know you are busy with family, work and many other activities. However, don't forget to keep healthy the spiritual dimension of your life. Don't forget to go to Jesus as the One who can bring you inner peace, a peace the world cannot give. Receive the inner strength and rest you need from Jesus, especially when you find life becoming burdensome and taking a toll on you.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question:

What is unique or different about the way Catholics read and are exposed to the Bible?

Answer:

Catholics are exposed to Scripture primarily through the Sunday readings from a book known as the Lectionary. The Lectionary is a book of selected passages from the Bible set in the context of a liturgical season, such as Advent, Lent, or ordinary time. There are four readings assigned to any Sunday: the first reading (usually from the Old Testament), the responsorial psalm, the second reading (usually from a New Testament letter), and the Gospel reading.

These readings together give them a new context. The selected readings relate to one another in a unique manner that is not present in the Bible text itself. In close proximity to each other, these readings now have the opportunity to converse with each other in a way that would have not been possible before. A homilist pays attention to all four readings, preparing a reflection that speaks of this conversation among the readings, enabling us to zero in on what this unique combination of God's word has to say to us this particular Sunday.

Next time you attend Sunday liturgy, try reading the Scripture ahead of time and see how this new relationship among the readings addresses and challenges you to be a better Christian here and now.


