

Dear Holy Name of Jesus Parish,

The 2017-2018 school year will bring changes to our Holy Name Educational building. Not to the building itself, but the number of students attending Religious Education will greatly increase. Starting in September, Holy Name of Jesus and St. Matthew will be combining religious education programs and meet here at Holy Name from 6:15-7:30 pm every Wednesday evening.

Realizing it makes sense for us to work together and better utilize our resources, Joy Orozco (St. Matthew Parish's DRE) and I weighed the pros and cons of such a change. After discussions, we presented it to Fr. Bob, and I am pleased to say, that with his support and blessing, we will begin jointly providing faith formation to nearly 200 youth from Kindergarten to 10th grade this fall.



This of course will increase the need for Catechists and support staff. Thanks to the support and cooperation of the Catechists from both parishes, we have filled almost all of the positions needed; that is even with the change of having two Catechists in each room for Safe Environment purposes. (See Catechists still needed on the education page of this bulletin.)

Bringing students to a deeper relationship with Christ, in a dedicated Catholic environment such as ours is terrific for religious education. But it also affords us the opportunity to provide and encourage the building of peer relationships through new activities. The first activity being offered will be open gym on Wednesdays from 5:30-6:10pm, starting the third week of class. More events will be published as they are scheduled.

Joy and I will both remain on staff at our specific parish, with all other responsibilities remaining the same for each of us. The only real change will be that Joy will work from the Holy Name Religious Ed office on Wednesdays, and we will share the responsibilities of Wednesday evenings and all that goes with that.

The youth of our parish are blessed to have a faith community that supports them in the programs that are provided here. Please continue to keep the children and Catechists in your prayers as we begin this new adventure with the faith formation of the children of Holy Name and St. Matthew.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question:

Why do we have a liturgical season called ordinary time? Can you explain?

Answer:

Ordinary time is the longest season of the liturgical year. It begins the Monday after January 6, the Epiphany, and goes until the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. That period can last anywhere from five to eight weeks, depending on when Easter is celebrated. Ordinary time picks up again the Monday after Pentecost Sunday and lasts from twenty-three to twenty-seven weeks, until the end of the liturgical year, the Saturday before Advent begins.

Why the name ordinary? "Ordinary" is not in contrast to "extraordinary" or "special" but rather stresses the Latin language notion of "ordinal" or numbered Sundays. The Latin title for the season, "tempus ordinarium," conveys the sense that this time of the year is measured or numbered time. Measured time can allude simply to the numbered Sundays, or the notion that these Sundays are a "measured" time to deepen and immerse ourselves completely in the realities of Jesus' incarnation, ministry, passion, death, and resurrection. Ordinary time offers us the opportunity to connect the ordinary lived experiences of our lives with those of Jesus, who modeled for us how to live a truly human existence.

GOSPEL MEDITATION17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"When he finds a pearl of great price, he goes and sells all that he has and buys it." Jesus today gives us the image of a merchant who knows he has discovered a great treasure. In fact, its value is so tremendous that the man is willing to sell EVERYTHING else in order to possess it. Why? Because he knows it will all be worth it. He knows that the pearl will bring him more reward than anything else he has ever owned, more even than all his possessions combined.

This Gospel story is meant to help us understand the unfathomable value of the kingdom of heaven. Nothing else can compare to it. No material item, no honor or success, can compete with this pearl of great price. Everything we have, short of this, is FINITE: limited, temporary, and ultimately fleeting. Eternal happiness, on the other hand, is INfinite. It never ends. This is the deep contentment, the satisfaction, the peace, and happiness that we crave, the kind that doesn't disappoint.

Like the merchant in the parable, we too should understand the value of this discovery. As Christians, we have "found" the treasure beyond all other treasures! Life in Christ, both now and in heaven, is truly the pearl of great price. The only question is whether we are willing to "sell" all that we have to obtain it. In other words, are we willing to release the other things that claim hold on us? Are we ready to put Christ first in our lives? All of us need to take pause from time to time and examine our attachments and priorities. Money, pleasure, success, or comfort can often seem so important to us that we falsely begin to imagine these things will bring the happiness we so desire. But the message is loud and clear today: the kingdom of heaven is the true treasure we long for.


