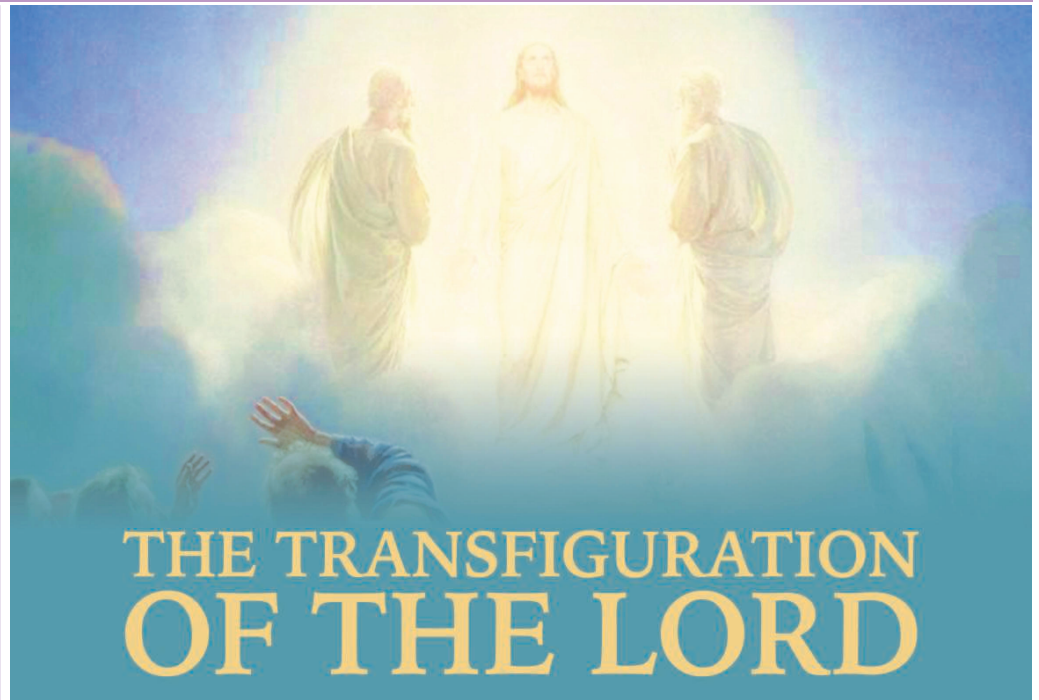

Growing Through Trials Like Peter

Most of us face some sort of serious challenge every so often in our lives involving: work, moving, marriage, sickness, injury, or some accident. And once in awhile we may even have to face a more catastrophic type of situation such as a loss of a limb, or the sudden death of a spouse, child, relative or a good friend, or get hit by a tornado, hurricane or flood, where we lose everything. How do we deal with these difficult trials in life? Some people self-medicate themselves through alcohol, drugs, sex, or engage in various dangerous and potentially deadly activities such as self-cutting as an unhealthy way to cope with emotional pain, trials or serious difficulties.

In today's Gospel Our Lord not only rescues Peter and the others from drowning but also strengthens their spirits and says to them, "*Courage. It is I. Do not be afraid.*" This story shows us that God is close to us in every trial, even when things look dark. A tragedy or a crisis in our life does not mean that God has abandoned us or doesn't care about us. No, God is with us, especially in those moments when our faith is being tested.

People get more muscular by exercising, likewise with every trial we endure with confidence in God, we also grow spiritually stronger and more mature. I have personally drawn a lot of personal inspiration from persons of ordinary faith that I have seen suffering through some sort of serious crisis or sickness in their life. Life is a journey to God, a journey of growth and maturation, and there is often more growth and maturation in the moments of suffering than when life is easy. Trials are always an opportunity to grow closer to God, to deepen our maturity and spiritual life, or not. We can also choose to become bitter, discouraged, and self-medicated through some destructive means.

Peter fails the test of faith by trusting in his own strength and so he sinks into the water. But later in his life we see a changed person one who had matured and grown spiritually: In his younger years, Peter speaks first and thinks afterwards; when he grew older, Peter relies on the Lord and allows the Lord to lead him. In his younger years, Peter denied knowing the Lord; when he grew older, we see Peter willing to go to prison twice for giving witness to Jesus. In his younger years, Peter complained about going to Jerusalem when Jesus mentioned that His impending passion and death would take place there; when he grew older, Peter no longer feared death and accepted being scourged, whipped and even crucifixion for proclaiming the Gospel.

If Peter had not endured all the earlier trials which allowed him to matured and grow spiritually, he would never have become the great Saint he became in his latter years. What about us? When trials come our way what do we do? What will we do? Do we self-medicate ourselves through alcohol, drugs, sex, or engage in some dangerous and potentially deadly activity, or are we willing to trust in God and the grace He can give to us? Are we allowing God's grace to do in us what we cannot do on our own? Do we hear Jesus saying to us, "*Courage. It is I. Do not be afraid,*"

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question:

On August 10 we celebrate the feast of St. Lawrence. Can you tell us a bit about him?

Answer:

Little is known about Lawrence other than he was a deacon during the reign of Emperor Valerian from 253-259. In 258, Valerian began a persecution of the Roman Church. Lawrence was in charge of the purse for the church of Rome. Roman officials demanded that the riches of the church be handed over to them. Lawrence asked for a few days to gather them.

Lawrence took the money he had charge over and distributed it to the poor of Rome. Then he gathered all the homeless and poor together. When the officials came again demanding the riches of the church, Lawrence pointed to the destitute and homeless, saying that these were the true riches of the church. For this he was imprisoned and tortured, and put to death by burning on a gridiron. It is said that as he was dying, he told his executioners to turn him over because he was done on one side and needed to be fully cooked for the Lord.

Lawrence continues to be a model for us today. The church needs continual reminders that its riches are the people. The primary purpose and mission of the church is to be continually sensitive to the needs of all God's people, most especially the least of our brothers and sisters.

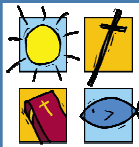
St. Peter's Tomb
