From the Pastor's Desk

Praised be Jesus Christ! Have you ever seen the movie "Contagion"? If you're at all nervous about the present pandemic, then I'd suggest you refrain. Even though it came out nearly a decade ago, it's the rage right now because it is a somewhat scientific depiction of how devastating an epidemic can be. When I watched it back on March 15th, I had no idea that was to be our last weekend in church for the next two months. Have I mentioned that I really miss you?! For the record, Federica (my rabbit friend) seems to have abandoned me - I haven't seen her in days. Her disappearance roughly coincides with when I ran out of apples to feed her, leading me to believe it was a utilitarian friendship after all! Two months . . . that is a long time to be without Mass and away from our parish community that we miss so much.

But none of this is unprecedented. When Saint Charles Borromeo was the Archbishop of Milan, he had to close the churches for nearly two years (1576-1577) as his city and people fought off the plague. And though it's not exactly the same thing, Japan was without the presence of the Catholic Church for nearly 250 years after their leaders evicted all of the clergy. In both cases the faith was passed on by ingenuity and sincerity. In the case of the Japanese, many generations were born, lived, and died without receiving Holy Communion a single time. But they were baptized by Catholics who truly believed in Jesus and taught their children and grandchildren to believe in Him too. When a French Catholic missionary came to Japan in the late 19th century, he was shocked to find people who ardently followed the Lord and His commandments. Even without the Church's clerical presence, the faith had survived. And it will here too.

"Faith of our fathers, holy faith . . ." We're familiar with that song and it's a good one. But we really need a song that recognizes the inestimable worth of the faith of our mothers. One way of reading history is through the lens of spiritual mothers. Think of the impact of Saint Helena (whose son, Constantine, legalized Christianity in the fourth century), Saint Monica (Saint Augustine's Mom), and Saint Zelie (Saint Therese of Lisieux's Mom). And that's not even mentioning the greatest Mama of all, Jesus' Mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary. The impact of a spiritual Mother is almost impossible to overestimate. If you'd like a spiritual exercise, spend some time in prayer thinking about the women who made the deepest impact on your faith. Besides my own Mom, I often think of how much my Grandmas helped my faith to grow.

When I was a high school religion teacher, one of the homework assignments I gave asked the kids to engage the spiritual exercise I just mentioned. These were seniors who were not as eager to impress me as younger students would have been. Nevertheless, they seemed to relish this assignment year in and year out. And their responses were some of the most touching I've ever come across. I can recall how these teenagers wrote almost exclusively about their Grandparents and the faith they lived. One would speak lovingly about her Grandma that prayed the Rosary multiple times each day while another marveled at how his Grandpa never missed daily Mass. It was probably upwards of 90% of my students that cited their Grandparents as their spiritual heroes. That's just one reason for us to take this time of quarantine seriously: protecting our elders keeps their spiritual wisdom and holiness in our world a bit longer.

In Jesus Christ we were saved in part by prayer and suffering – my Grandmas did a lot of both, which made them powerful women in my life. You already know about my Grandma Martin and how the diamond from her wedding ring is embedded in the chalice I use at Mass. My Grandma Breuer lived nearly 102 years and was faithful to God until the very end. She thought that her generation would

be the last to live so long as they were raised on hard work, healthier food, more sleep, and deeper faith. She excelled in the last category, and even though she often wondered why she lived so long (she outlived my Grandpa Breuer by nearly 30 years), she didn't waste a moment, praying and uniting her heart to the Lord until her last day. As an anecdote, I remember as a teenager attending the funeral of a relative and my Grandma Breuer was there too. After a chilly trip to the cemetery for the committal, Grandma told me, "Sam, if you ever become a priest and it's cold outside, keep it moving in the cemetery." Sage advice that I've done my best to obey.

The faith of our mothers . . . of all the gifts that my Grandma Breuer gave me, the one of greatest worth is my own Mama. Mom and Grandma were very close and I can hardly remember a Sunday night that Mom and Grandma didn't speak on the phone. I'm sure there were many struggles along the way, but their faith in God built an infallible bridge that helped them navigate the inevitable storms of life together. As we honor our Moms this weekend, we rightly remember their Moms, our Grandmas. For these women, with courage sometimes known only to God, forged a way for us to enter this world. And as if being born wasn't enough, they made it possible for us to believe in Jesus Christ and His promise of eternity. We owe our Mothers and Grandmothers so much. As we each try to thank God sufficiently for creating them, allow me to end with a poem made famous by Archbishop Fulton Sheen many moons ago:

Lovely Lady Dressed in Blue Lovely Lady dressed in blue -----Teach me how to pray! God was just your little boy, Tell me what to say! Did you lift Him up, sometimes, Gently on your knee? Did you sing to Him the way Mother does to me? Did you hold His hand at night? Did you ever try *Telling stories of the world?* O! And did He cry? Do you really think He cares If I tell Him things -----Little things that happen? And Do the Angels' wings Make a noise? And can He hear *Me if I speak low?* Does He understand me now? Tell me -----for you know. Lovely Lady dressed in blue -----Teach me how to pray! God was just your little boy, And you know the way.

May God bless our Mothers and Grandmothers and all spiritual Mothers – we love you!

Various and sundry observations from Holy Name of Jesus Parish:

- I. When will we be re-opening the church for public Masses? At this point, our hope is for the Feast of Pentecost, May 30th and 31st. As you know, once we open, things will be incremental and we'll still be abiding by social distancing and other prudent practices regarding hygiene. Please continue to pray for the end of the pandemic and for all who are suffering the most during this time. We'll let you know as soon as we have a plan for resuming our liturgical life at Holy Name.
 - a. First Holy Communion is tentatively planned for May 31st, but we'll have to proceed with caution until we know for sure. Confirmation will have to wait until a little later in the summer, but we'll schedule it as soon as we're able.
- II. How will we replace Summerfun, now that it's cancelled? As you know, replacing such a wonderful event is simply not possible. But we'll do our best to have some fun in the upcoming year and raise the funds we need to pay our bills and serve our community. The first priority is to sell all of our raffle tickets. We are giving away \$6,000.00 in prizes, so we'd at least like to break even. Please sell your tickets and come pick up some more. At this point we have not changed the date for the drawing, so selling all of the tickets during the month of May is important.
 - a. Our first event that is a substitute for Summerfun is the pizza sale that we're hosting next Sunday, May 17th. You can pre-order 14" pizzas from Papa Murphy's (please call 715-551-0040 to order) and we're selling pepperoni or sausage. We're accepting a free will offering, and all proceeds go to support Holy Name of Jesus parish. The pizzas will be fresh but not baked (so as to keep everything as hygienically pure as possible). Pick-up is Sunday, May 17th from 9:00-11:00 a.m. By the way, they're selling like hotcakes!
 - b. If you have ideas for other events, please let me or someone on staff know. We've been blessed to do little things the past few Sundays and we have an idea for May 24th too.
- III. We're still waiting on the sound system team to install the new components in church. That will include new speakers in the back of church. I hope this work is done before we return to church, but only time will tell.
- IV. Painting in church has begun. Once again, God willing this could be finished before we return. The carpet will come later at this point, I'm not sure when that will be installed, but certainly before August. By the way, these projects are all paid for by donations that mostly came in before I began as pastor last summer. The money was restricted for these projects and we just wanted to make sure we could balance the budget before moving forward. Thanks to all who contributed this year, and to the Providence of God, we did it!
- V. Don't forget to visit Jesus in church if you're able and willing. There's no pressure to come out, so I don't want you to feel guilty if you've been laying low in a spirit of caution and respect for others. But if you're healthy and wanting to stop by church, we're open 7 days a week, with confessions available every day. Eucharistic Adoration on Sunday morning is wonderful, though we'd really rather be attending Mass together. Check the bulletin for times when the church is open and confessions are available.


