## From the Pastor's Desk

Praised be Jesus Christ! Happy New Year! Because you're a very informed Catholic, you already know that Advent begins a new liturgical year in the Catholic Church. And given the many challenges of this past year, many are eager for a fresh beginning. Advent is a gift from God in that it invites us to prepare for the event that has forever marked the divide between our time in exile and our time as pilgrims on the way home to the Father. Although some secularists have tried to remove them, most still refer to those epochs as B.C. (before Christ) and A.D. (the year of the Lord, or "after death"). That first Christmas changed the world, though it was only as time went by that its impact would become clear.

Advent is our annual preparation for Christ's entrance into the world He created. Because we're restless creatures, we find patience difficult and often succumb to the relentless pursuit of whatever comes next. A local radio station started playing Christmas music sometime in early November. I remember driving home one Christmas after my last Mass and for the life of me, I could not find any Christmas music on the radio. The world was already on to the next thing!

Advent slows us down so that we can prepare our hearts for the coming of the great King. Because God speaks in the silence, we're encouraged to set aside time to be alone with the Lord and meditate on His Presence and His humility. We might consider "fasting" from social media and technology more often in these weeks before Christmas. Creating space in our lives and hearts for God has always borne fruit in deeper peace and more courageous hope. One prayer that comes to us from long ago is aptly titled the "Christmas Novena." It begins on the Feast of Saint Andrew (November 30<sup>th</sup>) and is recited 15 times per day until Christmas day. As with any sincere prayer, we're changed slowly but surely as we recite the words. Here is the prayer for those who would like to pray it . . . and at 15 times per day, you'll have it memorized in no time:

*Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son  
Of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at  
midnight, in Bethlehem, in piercing cold.  
In that hour, vouchsafe, O my God, to  
hear my prayer and grant my  
desires, through the merits  
of Our Savior, Jesus  
Christ, and of His  
Blessed Mother.  
Amen.*

Advent is also a time to think of others and focus on ways of serving Christ in our brothers and sisters. Gift giving at Christmas is a source of joy as we see the happiness of others when they open our gifts. As in many things, it's important to exercise moderation and not spend beyond our means. Incidentally, buying things is only one way to experience the joy of giving. I found the following anecdote on a friend's blog and it illustrates a beautiful truth that is championed by Advent:

*They brought balloons to a school. One was given to every student, who had to inflate it, write their name on it and throw it in the hallway. The teachers then mixed all the balloons. The students were given 5 minutes to find their own balloon. Despite a hectic search, no one found their balloon. At that point the teachers instructed the students to take the first balloon that they found and deliver it to the person whose name was written on it. Within 5 minutes everyone had their own balloon.*

*The students were then given the lesson: "These balloons are like trying to find happiness. We will never find it if everyone is preoccupied with looking for their own. But if we care about other people and help them find theirs, in the process we'll find ours too."*

In saving the best for last, Advent is an invitation to allow the Christ Child more deeply into our life. In prayer we can even experience the wonder of holding Him as a baby. While our hearts cannot yet bear the full mystery of a God who became one of us, allowing Him to take away our shame and guilt is still the most powerful means we have for truly trusting Him. Jesus knew we feared God, so He came in the most approachable way imaginable. After all, who could ever be afraid of a baby! In the sacrament of confession, we become like Jesus in humbling ourselves. Unlike Jesus, we admit that there are things in our life that we regret. There is something about a baby that awakens a deep desire in us to be good, holy, and right with others. Jesus knew this, so He left His power of forgiveness and reconciliation in the world. Every validly ordained priest carries this power and makes it regularly available in the confessional. There are many opportunities for you to let Jesus take your sins away. He invites you to trust Him.

Advent is difficult because we're always in a hurry. COVID has slowed our world down considerably, like it or not. And that's not all bad. Mistakes are multiplied when we hurry, and stress and anxiety increase when we feel under the gun. Learning to patiently prepare and wait for Jesus' birth is not easy for us. But we often find in life that the best things are the most challenging. The old adage, "*the greater the struggle, the more glorious the triumph*," comes to mind. This past year has been an extraordinary struggle. But for those who engage it, Advent signals the glorious triumph that even now is coming over the near horizon.

May we embrace Advent, so that we come to Jesus' birth with clean souls and peaceful hearts!

## 1st Sunday of Advent

You are at the eye doctor and it's time for the peripheral vision test. You know the one. It's where you put your head up to a contraption and have to click a switch every time you see a squiggly line. If you don't concentrate and maintain optimal focus, you will miss them and skew the outcome of the test. You can easily find yourself with a diagnosis that really isn't accurate! Concentration and focus are key to succeeding with this evaluation. They are also key to developing a healthy, vibrant spiritual life. If we do not bring our full consciousness to the task, concentrate with all our might, be watchful and vigilant, we are not going to see God's loving presence flashing before our eyes!

That's why we need Advent. Let's face it. We can easily get distracted, focus on nonessential and superficial things and lose touch with what really matters. Our attentions wander. We daydream and even become a bit overwhelmed and tired. All of the stresses and demands of life consume us and we find ourselves constantly trying to play catch up rather than relishing the moment of the now. "Now" moments are so fleeting. They flash before us like those squiggly lines on a screen. Present moments go as quickly as they come but it is important to discover them and rest in them as often as we can. Though gone in a flash, these now moments of encounter with God teach powerful lessons and offer a grounding in truth that can be found nowhere else. It's the grace of Advent to become watchful and attentive because we are never sure when God will surprise us.

God loves surprises and love thrives on them! God's now moments of surprises come as tender instants of intimate connection where I find profound peace, experience joy, and rest in love. These are Advent times reflective of the now moments when Christ first was born, when God surprises us during every time we care to watch and when the great surprise of Christ's second coming dawns upon us all. But, to discover the grandeur and experience the awe of these now times, we have to be ready. We have to want to be there. We have to believe. And, we have to have the desire to soak in as much as we can in the time we have before us.

1. Those who cultivate the habit of thankfulness experience true Christian joy. And isn't this something that we desire? When we count our many blessings, our attitude can turn away from any discouragement and lead us to be more generous with others.
2. The more we hear "thank you" come from our mouth, the more we notice what people are doing for us and it can help to shift an attitude of discouragement as well. This Thanksgiving, consider a person in your family you need to verbally thank for something specific; or thank a family member for who they are and what they mean to you. Growing in the habit of being thankful to God and others is well worth the effort.
3. We have every reason to be thankful. Jesus gave His life for us, experiencing the worst possible pain on the Cross, so that we can have eternal life with Him forever. And the Cross is in the shape of the letter "t" which reminds us of the word "thanksgiving." Giving thanks to Jesus will foster greater humility as we recognize His incredible love for us.
4. Being thankful leads to peace and calm, which keeps us healthy. When we focus on what we do have, rather than what we don't have, stress diminishes, our shoulders relax and we can function better in so many ways.

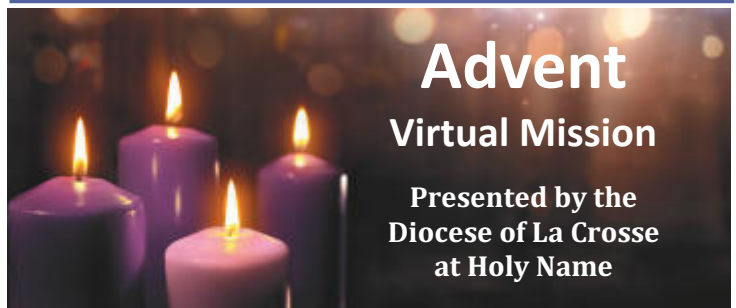

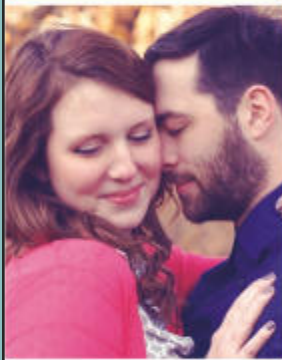
