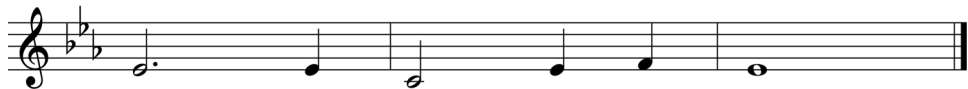
## Psalm 992

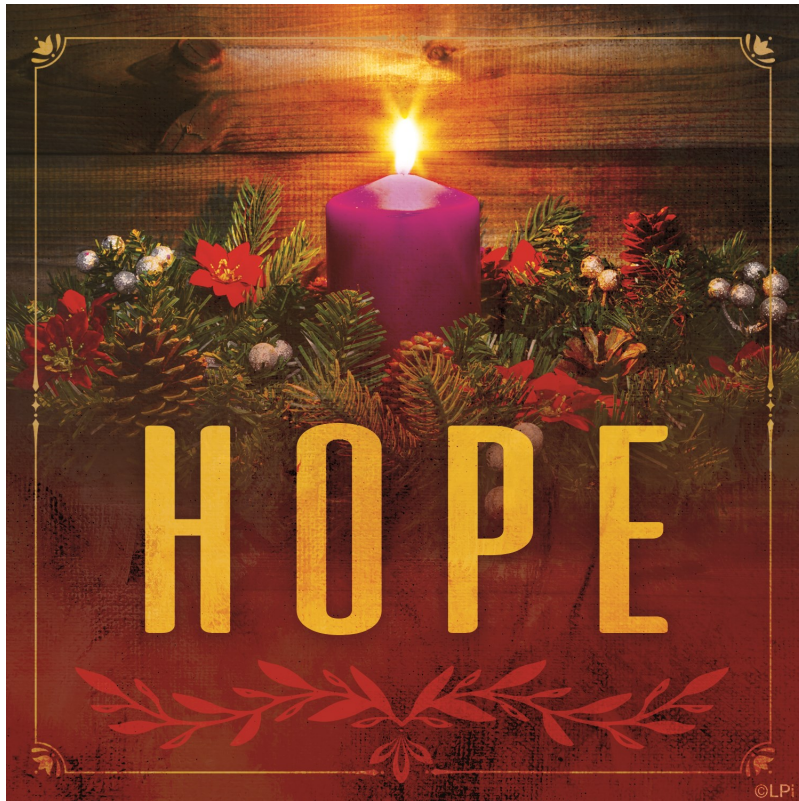
